The #thisisMYchurch campaign of the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod (LCMS) is intended for the sharing of these stories of how, by God's grace, the LCMS is making a difference in lives and communities at home and abroad.

LCMS members everywhere are invited to share these and their own stories of how the Gospel is going forth, with their family members, neighbors and co-workers.

International Mission

LCMS Mercy Medical Team members went door-to-door in rural Africa to introduce the nearby medical clinic, and word spread like wildfire through the small villages surrounding the school where the clinic was stationed.

By the time the medical volunteers arrived, a queue already formed outside the registration tent. The first patient, who arrived with tattered clothes and yellowed eyes, was one of approximately 2,000 patients treated during the week.

Mercy Medical Team volunteers worshipped with a local parish of our partner church in Africa, and held team members held nightly devotions. They shared stories of a power loss at the hotel (or no power or hot water), flaming showerheads, traveler's sickness, outhouse bathrooms and – of angst to some – very little, if any, Internet access.

"While the physical healing and relief that we provide is needed and necessary, we are only there for a short time," said Tracy Quaethem, manager for LCMS Life and Health Ministries. "We come, we serve, and we return home to share our stories."

Each year, the LCMS sends several teams with about 12 volunteers per group. Volunteers choose whether to fund raise trip or pay for the trip on their own.

"A Mercy Medical Team lasts far longer than the week or two that we are there," Quaethem said. "After we leave, there is follow-up medical care available for those who need it most through the partner church. ... Most team members remember their patients in prayer long after the trip is over – many times for months or years."

Touching Lives

Mike shared a story about an individual from our church family who reached out to Pastor Pasche about a year ago. He was in financial need and wanted to know if the church could help. Pastor Pasche asked Mike Eggert if the church had any money to assist with this kind of need. Mike said there was a very small amount. He asked Pastor if he could go and visit the man. Pastor asked the man if that would be ok with him, and he said that it would. Mike went out to the man's home, learned that his wife had health issues, cupboards were bare, and the electricity was going to be turned off that day. Mike asked if there was family that could help. That had already been done; family had been tapped out. Mike decided that he would go to the utility company and pay the bill. Mike started delivering Meals on Wheels to this family. One month went by, and the man again told Mike that his electricity was going to be turned off. Mike learned that he had actually only paid the money owed from previous months. The man finally broke down and shared with Mike that he had a gambling problem. Mike made the decision to pay the utility bill, again out of his own pocket. Time went by, and one day the man repaid \$100 to Mike, only a fraction of what Mike had paid out. Many more months went by. The man stopped by church one day and gave Mike an envelope with the rest of the money although Mike had never asked to be repaid. Many tough changes have occurred in the man and his wife's lives. They also have started coming back to church. It is heartwarming to hear how individuals, along with faith in the Lord, can help to touch lives. (retold with permission)

Approval of February Minutes

Justin made a motion to approve minutes, and Mike seconded with all voting aye with Cindy and Lynn abstaining since they were not present at the February meeting.

Approval of Treasurer's Report

General Fund had a negative balance of \$17,580.85 and Little Lambs accounts had a positive balance of \$2,814.67. Cash flow in all accounts had a positive balance of \$44, 523.62. Building maintenance account had a balance of \$90, 001.97 and AV account had \$64,000 with \$11,364.32

being disbursed for the new AV system. The building mortgage fund had a balance of \$45,236.82, leaving 3.60 months of reserve. Lee made a motion to approve February report and Lynn seconded with all voting in favor.

Authorized Signers

Mike explained that we need proof from Peace Lutheran Church who authorized signers are. Mike suggested that officers from Mission and Ministry always be authorized signers. Two signers are always needed for loans, safety deposit boxes, and Lutheran Church Extension Fund withdrawals. One signature is needed for check signing, contracts, and legal documents. Lee made a motion to authorized signers on financial and legal documents for PLC to be the four elected officers from mission and ministry council, and Cindy seconded the motion. Current officers are: President: Dan Cowger; Vice-President, Nick Brellenthin; Secretary, Lynn Brown, and Treasurer, Mike Eggert.

Review of official reimbursement policy

The final draft of the official policy for reimbursement of incurred expenses for PLC employees was reviewed; no changes were made.

Approval of sick time policy change

Mike passed out the sick leave policy with a proposed revision to the policy stating that PLC employees' sick leave will not carry over from one anniversary year to the next anniversary year. Sick time that is not used will be lost. Maximum hours for sick leave will be 40 hours per year. After initial 60 days of employment, all employees will be granted 40 hours of sick time per year. Nick made a motion to approve, and Lynn seconded with 7 voting in favor, and Dan abstaining. One employee has 300 sick hours accrued. Nick made a motion that \$1 for every hour of accrued sick time be paid to all employees; Justin seconded it, with 6 voting in favor, one voting nay, and Dan abstaining.

Review of Vacation Time Policy

Vacation policy was revised and reviewed. Justin made a motion to accept the revised policy, Lee seconded it, with all voting aye. The policy is available for review in the finance office. Revisions have no budgetary impact.

Transfer of accounts from Lutheran Church Extension Fund (LCEF)

After Mike proposed the suggestion to merge accounts, Dan made a motion to merge (3) LCEF accounts with related dedicated accounts, and Lee seconded it with all voting aye.

Results of e-mail vote to hire custodian

Hiring of custodian was unanimously approved, per hiring committee recommendation, via email vote on March 11, 2017.

Katie Luther Event

Dan asked who would be available to serve lunch at the Katie Luther Event on Saturday, April 30th as Mission and Ministry had been asked to help by Dorcas. Four people currently are available to serve.

Audio Visual Update

Contract was signed with Audio Video Electronics, Maple Grove, MN, to finish the AV equipment grade level into Outlook. Also, more adult volunteers to help with cleaning at Peace Place would be great. Five paid custodial hours per week are allocated for Peace Place.

Special Events Update

Cindy met with Marlys to update the council on upcoming activities at PLC.

Call Committee Update

Lee presented the call committee update. As of March 15th, nine meetings have taken place to make changes to job descriptions and additional details to formal call documents. These recommendations will be submitted to the Elders and the Mission and Ministry Council. When their approval is received, a special voters' meeting will be scheduled to approve the issuance of the pastor calls.


