The end of Summer is always a time of mixed emotions for me. Like parents, teachers and students – it means schedules will begin to change and become busier. The staff at Peace Lutheran are busy planning and getting ready for a new year of Sunday School, Confirmation classes and Youth ministry.

This year the staff wants to remind parents and students that as things become busy - God is with us – ready to help and remind us that we are His blessing to the world. The first two days of school we will be offering “blessings” as you start the new school year. We are asking you to stop by the Peace Lutheran north parking lot and receive a “blessing” on your way to school.

The word “blessing” comes from the ancient practice of weighing coins on a scale to determine value. Blessing someone “adds value” to his or her life. We see in Scripture the word “bless” or “blessing” used almost seven hundred times. The Bible also gives us great evidence that our God is a God of blessing. We receive that blessing from our Heavenly Father and have the wonderful opportunity to pass it on.

Pastor Bill Tucker, Concordia Lutheran San Antonio, TX talks about parents blessing their students as a part of affirming God’s value of your child. Here are five basic elements of a blessing that, combined, have tremendous impact.

B – BE COMMITTED: The blessing is not a fleeting moment or mere symbolic event. It includes an active, long-term commitment to the child’s well-being by accepting responsibility to help them become all God intends.

L – LOVINGLY TOUCH: The power of a hug or placing your hand on your child while affirming him or her creates an important physical connection and communicates warmth, acceptance, and relational health.

E – EXPRESS VALUE: Just like we add value to someone’s pocket by handing them a coin, we add to a child’s life when we use words that attach high value to them as a person.

S – SEE POTENTIAL: Parents best see a child’s natural strengths and foresee possibilities for their future. Giving the blessing includes picturing a special future and cheering them toward achieving their potential.

S – SAY IT: An effective blessing must be put into words whether spoken, written or both. Simply being present is not enough to communicate the blessing. Words of affirmation are necessary for the child to know he or she is appreciated and accepted.

Speak words of blessing to your child while driving to school, tucking into bed, celebrating an accomplishment or good effort, or writing a note to place in their lunch. Create your own phrase using any of the following: “You Are Great Because...” “I was so proud of you when you...” “I think God is going to use you in the future to...” “God has gifted you with an ability to...” Praying for God’s favor and protection to be with someone is expressing Christian love for your neighbor. May God use you to pass on His “blessings” in the lives of your neighbors. And may the Lord’s richest blessings be with you!

Small Group Series ?***



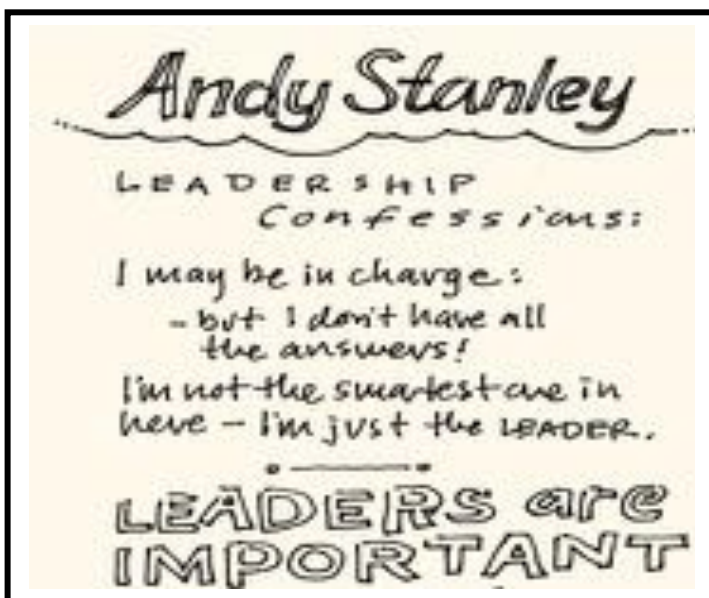

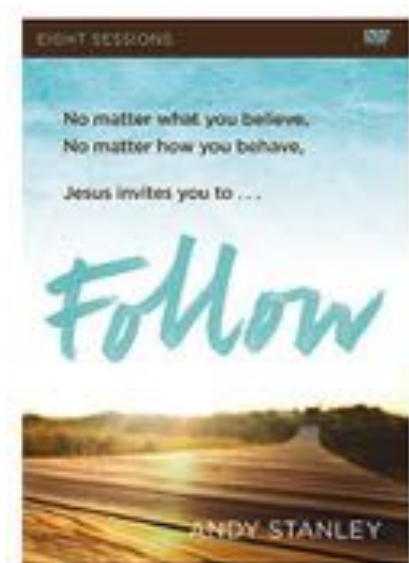

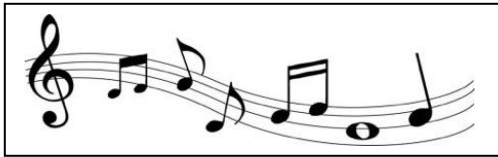
Religion Says, “Change and you can join us”. Jesus says, “Join Us and you will Change”.

Cheer: July report - The visiting committee took the month off. A total of 15 cards was sent.

Card Shop: Cards were sold for a total of \$ 30.00.

Mission and Ministry Minutes - August 15, 2017



Members Present: Pastor Pasche, Pastor Bode, Paul Berg, Lee Uldbjerg, Nick Brellenthin, Dan Cowger, Mike Eggert, Deanna Puchalski, Heidi Sickmann, Cindy Mons. Devotion and prayer by Pastor Pasche.

Touching Lives: Pastor Bode shared how the Holy Spirit has lead him in the ministry and how over the years of leading the youth, Bible study, preaching and leading the Church the fire in his heart for the word has not diminished. The more time spent in the word the more you recognize the leading of the Holy Spirit.

Approval of July Minutes: Mike made a motion to approve the minutes, and Deanna seconded the motion. All voting aye with members not present at the July meeting abstaining.

Approval of Treasurer's Report: General Fund for 2017 -\$57,376.80; Little Lambs Balance for 2017 \$8,956.72; Building (Long Term Maintenance) Balance \$65,369.82; Building (TTNG) Balance \$22,819.99 which gives us 1.81 months in reserve. To date we have paid \$132,301.66 on principle to LCEF. Two large memorials helped to accomplish this. Our Cash Flow for 2017 -\$73,884.42. The report was approved by Lee and seconded by Heidi with all voting aye. Mike stated giving was down 7% which is about the same as last year at this time. The line of credit at Citizen's Bank at this time is \$80,000. This is due to cash flow and \$40,000 will be paid back within a month. Boni Schanil has been hired as of August 14 as the bookkeeper.

Little Lambs: Heidi reported everything is going well and they are gearing up for the summer help to return to school. There is a parent appreciation scheduled for the end of August.

Youth Ministry: Deanna reported on the Youth Ministry. It was a very successful high school mission trip to Idaho. The summer weekly high school youth group has between 20 – 25 youth. The summer weekly middle school madness is in conjunction with HAY (Hutchinson Area Youth worker). This event is shared with area churches to do fellowship and a devotion. The program ran from May 23 – August 1 and was held at St. A's.

Ministry in Motion Series: This is a series of presentations highlighting the ministries in our Church. The first meeting was held with Jan Bakken, Joleen & Chris Dennis and Lynn Brown. They will be putting the presentations together.

Special Events: Cindy reported on various events on the Church calendar.

Ministry of Operations: Paul handed out the 2017 – 2018 Student Registration Form. Lisa Kirchoff did an excellent job of putting this together. The registration form is for student opportunities ages 3 through high school. This form will also be used to update family & student information on the new computer system. Paul also discussed the upcoming Bible Study. The small Bible Study groups will be discussing discipleship starting October 8. The Sunday morning 8:15 & 9:15 Bible Study will on the 500th Anniversary of the Reformation.

Pastors' Update: Pastor Bode will be attending a conference in Wisconsin on Discipleship. Pastor Pasche stated Principal Boll from Our Savior's Lutheran in Hutchinson will be having a workshop on the changes in Minnesota Public Schools on August 22, at 6:30. Pastor Pasche asked if the Council would be interested in a presentation by Dr Johnson from MNS District. The presentation would be an evaluation on how we can better Connect, Grow & Serve. The Council decided this would be a good opportunity and will coordinate a meeting with Dr Johnson's schedule.

Employee Health Care Plan: Mike reported there is a 4% increase on the Concordia Plan Services. After discussion, there was a motion by Nick to approve the health care plan. The motion was seconded by Heidi with all voting aye.

A motion was made to adjourn the meeting by Lee and seconded by Deanna. Pastor Bode closed in prayer.

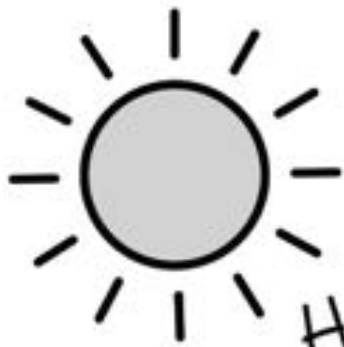
Release Time
