

Call to Order: Nick

Opening Devotion: Pastor Bode opened with a word of prayer.

Approval of April Minutes: Mike made a motion to accept, and Cindy seconded the motion with all voting aye.

Approval of Treasurer's Report: Money from youth fundraisers is going out as fast as it is coming in to pay associated expenses. We are in the black for the year. Otherwise, everything is pretty normal. General fund had a negative balance of \$41,418.89. Little Lambs Christian Center had a balance of \$15,037.86. Cash flow in all accounts had a balance of \$7,596.11. Building maintenance fund had a balance of \$78,195.81. Building mortgage fund had a balance of \$18,730.13, leaving 1.49 months in reserve. Lee made a motion to accept. Kim seconded the motion with all voting aye. Director of Operations Report: Paul said that the Mission and Ministry Council will be serving a meal at 5:00 on June 15th for the Matthew 14:16 community outreach dinner.

Trustee Recommendation: The Council agrees with the recommendation from the Trustees that Dr. Joan will be responsible for selecting the company that maintains the organ.

Minister Update: Receipts from staff are now being turned in on a regular basis. Six weeks of leadership training with Steve Gasser has been completed. Staff will be looking at fundraising policy as we move into the latter part of summer. Rebecca Stark has been hired as part-time secretary. She is assuming some of Melva's tasks. A hiring committee is being formed to hire the part-time bookkeeper. Vacation Bible School will be held the first week in June. There was tremendous turnout at the last several services with Sunday School recognition, graduate recognition, and confirmation. Formal meeting concluded at 7:30 so as to meet with the trustees and Dr. Phil Johnson, who presented the mission formation consultation process that he had previously presented to the Council. The Council had approved a recommendation at the November 21, 2017 meeting to move forward with this process.

Touching Lives: Troy shared a personal story about a trip to Denver so that his daughter could participate in VBS with his sister who leads VBS at her church. To make this happen, Troy needed to help care for his three young nephews and niece as well in order for his daughter to have this opportunity. His sister's church reached 250 youth, and when Troy saw the culmination of the week's activities, he felt blessed to be a part of seeing how those lives were touched. Pastor Pasche shared another story about two youth who have been attending youth group but are not members of the church. They are going on one of PLC's youth mission trips this summer. As all of the youth do, they work hard at raising funds in order to make this happen. Due to other personal needs, additional help was needed to fund their respective portion of the costs. Erika approached Pastor Pasche, asking him if he knew of anyone in the congregation who might be able to help with this financial need. Pastor did in fact have a couple in mind. While he was going to retrieve their phone number, he turned around, and they were standing there!! Not only were they willing to fund the needed amount but also donated more than was needed. The Holy Spirit was working through all of these individuals!!!

Approval of May Minutes: Lee made a motion to approve the May minutes, and Kim seconded, with all voting aye. **Approval of Treasurer's Report:** Financial situation is not as good as it could be. Little Lambs continues to be in the black. There are three payrolls in June. General fund had a negative balance of \$54,082.94. Little Lambs Christian Center had a balance of \$17,177.91. Cash flow in all accounts had a negative balance of \$14,932.63. Building maintenance fund had a balance of \$78,506.06. Building mortgage fund had a balance of \$20,100.26, leaving 1.60 months in reserve. Lynn made a motion to approve and Deanna seconded, with all voting aye.

Pastor Updates: Pastor Pasche and Lee will be attending the annual conference this week. A new president will be elected for the MN South District. Recent staff leadership training was beneficial with helping the staff to work as a team. Pastor continues to convey to staff how their work at PLC relates to the mission statement. Rebecca, the new secretary, is coordinating her hours with Melva. Rita, our new bookkeeper is working with Mike, our treasurer.
