





Call to Order: Nick

Devotions: Pastor Pasche opened with prayer.

Touching lives: Kim told us that when the Red Cross was in town, collecting blood, there was a conversation about having Faith. Two strangers, two women, connected together in conversation about how important having faith and trusting God can be.

Approval of Minutes: Chuck made the Motion, Kim 2nd it, Motion carried. Minutes from August 2019 are approved. **Treasurer's Report**: Troy put the reports up on the screen and highlighted. Building account and Mortgage account are looking good, dedicated funds account also looks good. We are in the 8th month of the year, and down about \$6000, but

the budget was also cut from last year. Lee handed out Little Lambs report and highlighted. Coleen made the Motion to approve Troy's report as submitted., Chuck 2 it, Motion carried. Treasure's report for August was approved.

Minister of Operations: Paul talked about the upcoming Fall Bible Studies, "God's Story is Your Story", starting Oct.

20th. Still needing some small group leaders.

1st Sunday in October is LWML Sunday.

Paul talked about some maintenance plans. Assessment work is done for sidewalk, etc. We have \$1500 already put toward it, (not 6000, as originally thought). Total assessment was \$9000.

Scholarship Fund: \$2400 available, this year applications must be in by Nov. 17th.

Discussion of Staffing: Motion made by Troy to approve Stacy Miller hired at 10-hour position, replacing Lisa Kirchoff's

position as Early Childhood Communication Coordinator. Motion was 2nd, and approved unanimously.

Lee made the Motion that Peace create a part-time position to help lead the Youth Program at 10 hours per week, with a

job description to come. Discussion followed, Nick 2 Motion, Motion was carried unanimously.

Mission and Ministry asked that Becky Puckett might accept this position. Troy said she might but would not want to get paid. Council discussed that if it's a paid position, then there would be a job description and job requirements, and this is what we need right now is to have more organized Youth direction, recognizing that the volunteers have done a tremendously awesome job.

Jeff: Youth Ministry- Primary discussion at Elder's Meeting.

Nick- I am excited, we as a church are really going to go somewhere. I've been hearing lots of excitement about the new changes, about the Prescriptions, the Steering team, the Vision team.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Pasche- The "Vision" team is giving a push to move ahead. Turn out seems good on the survey response, leading up to Wed. Oct 9 the evening events. Pastor Frith will be there to give us the survey results, we will break into small groups. This is another way to be heard, the "Vision" team wants our ideas.

Lee made a Motion to adjourn meeting, Chuck 2 Motion, Motion carried. Meeting is adjourned, 8:08pm
