As we begin reopening the church building to welcome you and your families back to worshiping together in-person, there are many questions as to what returning to church will look like. **The Social Distancing Safety Measures below are intended to help answer some of the most common questions.** These plans are subject to change based on the latest information on COVID-19.

Social Distancing Safety Measures:

- Attendance inside is limited to 25% of normal occupancy. Peace Center will be used for overflow.
- Maintain at least 6 feet between family groups in pews/chairs.
- No food or drink is allowed, this includes drinking fountains.
- Hand sanitizer will be available at all entryways.
- Public spaces will be sanitized between services.
- Restrooms should have no more than 2 persons at one time.
- Masks are encouraged but not required.
- Hymnals will be removed from the pews.
- Bulletins will be printed for single use.
- Offering baskets will be at the rear of the church and in the basket outside.
- 8:30 am Communion will be offered after the closing song.
- 10:00 am will be outside in the parking lot, rain or shine. Persons may bring lawn chairs or drive-in.
- Anyone showing any symptoms of sickness should not attend; this includes anyone who has a household member who is sick or showing symptoms of sickness. The vulnerable are encouraged to remain at home.
- Essential services at Peace Lutheran Church includes worship, weddings, baptisms and funerals. This does not allow social gatherings, small groups or other support meetings.
