COVID – 19 Preparedness Plan for Public Worship
Before returning to church, please read

posted 9/9/20

- Meetings for Peace Lutheran groups as well as outside organizations are NOW PERMITTED on the Peace Lutheran Church campus, but limited to 50% capacity of the room you are using.
- We ask that you schedule your meeting with the church office (320)587-3031 in order for us to have the area sanitize.
- Those who are ill, those who have been in contact with someone diagnosed with COVID-19, and those who are particularly vulnerable to the SARS-CoV-2 coronavirus will be urged to stay home. People will be encouraged to check their temperature before they come.
- Practice good hygiene: cover coughs and sneezes, wash hands often, wear face coverings or masks.
- People will be encouraged to bring and wear their own cloth face masks and other appropriate protective gear. A limited number of masks will be available at church to use and take home.
- The building will be thoroughly sanitized before and after each service, including all entryways and doors.
- Worship attendance in the sanctuary will be limited to 50% of seating capacity (in the church and in the balcony). Peace Center will be used for overflow.
- Households can be seated together - maintaining physical distancing of at least six feet from other households or individuals.
- The Sacrament of the Altar will be prepared and distributed by the pastor and elders. They will sanitize their hands, wear gloves and a mask. We are asking you to “cup” your hands so a wafer may be dropped into your hands. You are asked to take an individual glass from the tray, being careful not to touch the other glasses.

Weddings and Funerals are permitted

- Stay home if you or anyone in your household is sick or has symptoms: fever, cough, shortness of breath, chills, muscle aches, headache, sore throat, loss of taste or smell.
- Persons who are at higher risk for severe illness (elderly or underlying health conditions) are strongly encouraged to stay home.
- Participants should understand and agree to follow the COVID-19 Preparedness Plans for the facilities where the service or ceremony will take place.
- Singing is a higher risk activity, so congregations are strongly encouraged to listen to a cantor who maintains distance from other cantors and participants during the service.

Receptions or gatherings that are providing food and beverages for on-site consumption have a limit of indoor and outdoor occupant capacity of 25% up to 250 persons.

- Food must be prepared and served in accordance with applicable rules and regulations guiding the specific event. Licensed food establishments must follow the Minnesota Food Code (www.health.state.mn.us/communities/environment/food/rules/foodcode/index.html).
- Control lines to ensure social distancing of at least 6 feet between members of different households. This can be done with floor markings or other indicators.
- Self-service food and beverage areas are allowed as long as oversight of the self-service area to ensure that social distancing is maintained, hands are being sanitized, and participants wear face masks in the self-service area. The responsible party can be the venue administrator or caterer.
- Face coverings may be temporarily removed to enable eating and/or drinking when attendees are seated and apart from members of other households but must be put back on when not eating or drinking.

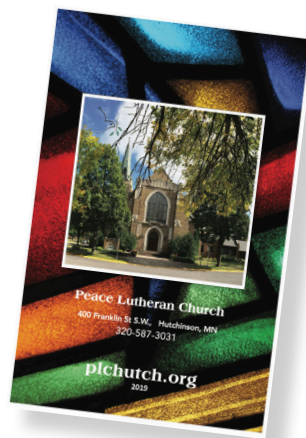

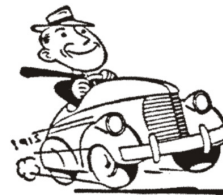

CHILDREN'S MINISTRY**Sunday School**

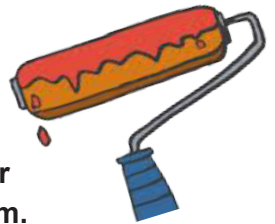

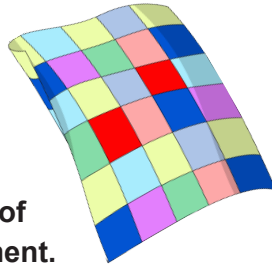
We will be following the CDC guidelines and masks are required. If you have any questions please call Phyllis at 587-0185 or Shirley at 587-5064.

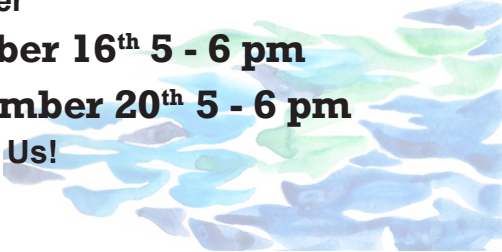

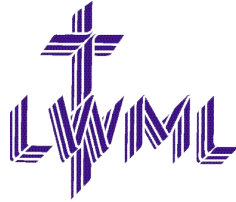

Coleen made the Motion to accept August 2020 Treasurer's Report, Motion was 2nd by Kim. Motion was carried.

Council Pres. Nick: Nick talked about his calls to Ambassadors of Reconciliation. They are having hard times due to Covid and are hard to reach. Pastor confirmed they are aware we are calling, from a message he got from Dr. Johnson. Nick thanked everyone on council for their work and dedication. So many good things happening even if the world seems messy right now, God is taking care of us. Nick filled us in on working on the Prescription #5 as Dr. Johnson had recommended.

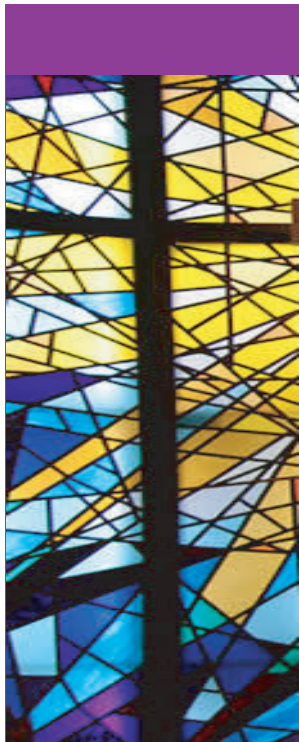

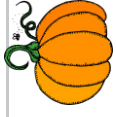
