# A Message from the Congregational President

Greetings in the name of Jesus Christ,

On behalf of the Mission and Ministry Council, thanks to our staff and countless volunteers that supported our many successful summer activities (Vacation Bible School, the Summer Concert and Salad Luncheons, Youth Guitar Camp, Hangouts, and HAY activities, the Annual Garage Sale, numerous LLCC field trips, and the cultivation and nurturing of our flowers and plants).

If you were unable to attend our August 8th Congregational Meeting, we discussed the Worship Committee Survey results and the pastoral care transition guidance and implementation from MN South District President Pastor Lucas Woodford. The complete worship survey report was 42 pages long. Although the survey was conducted to receive input to determine our fall worship schedule, concerns regarding non-worship related topics were received and included: budgetary concerns - cemetery, status of the parsonage, staff salaries, selling Peace Place to pay down debt; music programming - lack of choirs, the need for song leaders; management of the previous call committee for an associate pastor, and the transition plan for pastoral care. The Council and Board of Elders are aware of these concerns. We welcome you to attend one of our meetings to discuss any of these issues in more detail.

As we begin our fall programing in a few weeks we will miss the contributions of Shannon Campbell who resigned August 14 to become the new Director of Music and Worship, at Christ the King. We thank her for her service and wish her well as she pursues her passion for music ministry. We are actively seeking applications for her replacement. During the interim Sandy Kephart will be coordinating youth activities with the Youth Board.

As a result of the staffing shortage our staff and Human Resources Committee met and determined it best to make the following programming changes for Fall:

- Eliminate Wed evening worship after Sept. 8th
- Schedule all evening worship services at 6:30 pm
- Only offer 6th grade confirmation after school

We remain grateful for God's continuing grace and guidance as we focus on the tasks before us.

- **1. Call to order:** The meeting was called to order by Bob. Opening prayer led by Bob.
- **2. Approval of Minutes:** Approval for June 15, 2021 & June 22, 2021 minutes. Barb made a motion to approve both sets of minutes, Chuck seconded the motion. Motion carried.

#### 3. Reports:

LLCC: Heather reported that more space is needed to accommodate the number of children this fall in the before and after school program. A variance was given by the Fire Marshall to use two rooms in the basement of PLC. They would be used both before and after school hours. LLCC is requesting to use the two classrooms to meet codes needed for the number of children. LLCC will incur the cost of what is needed to be done to meet code requirements for the space. Kevin made a motion to approve the use of the space. Kathy seconded the motion. Motion carried. Lynn reported that an electronic brochure was shared for dropin daycare and that posters for back up childcare are up in the community and on the PLC & LLCC websites. The final DHS state grant of \$6000 was paid in June. LLCC will receive \$4250 from the American Rescue Plan. LLCC is in the black by \$9700, partly due to grant money. Little Lambs will have an end of the summer celebration at the Rec Center on August 27 and is also preparing plans with PLC to celebrate LLCC's ten-year anniversary which is on September 12.

**Treasurer:** Kevin reported that the budget is being maintained. He asked permission to contact the person that helps with Quick-Books to assist Sue in the office. There is no formal backup system for our computers. Kevin requested iCloud be put on up to 10 computers to obtain backup. The cost is \$299.25 for two years of coverage. Kevin made a motion to approve the purchase of the iCloud program. Shirley seconded the motion. Motion carried. Lutheran Church Extension Fund contacted Kevin stating we have approximately \$10,000 in a fund. Kevin requested the money to be sent to PLC where it will be put it towards the principal of the building mortgage. Bob will provide Citizens Bank and Trust the names of our officers (Lynn Brown, Kim Borka, Kevin Heikes, Robert Sylvester) as signatories on the line of credit at the bank.

**Pastor Pasche:** The planning meeting with staff for the upcoming year occurred. Wednesday night services are continuing.

**Elders:** John reported that a Saturday night service will begin in the fall, along with keeping Wednesday night services and Sunday services. The annual garage sale is being organized.

Human Resources Committee: Lynn reported that they have met 4 times since the last meeting. Revised job descriptions have been updated and reviewed by staff. Lynn made a motion to approve the job descriptions. Barb seconded the motion. Motion carried. Personnel files will be updated in the next couple of weeks and the personnel manual update is nearly completed. It will be sent to

the MMC for discussion and approval at the August meeting. The committee interviewed Sue and the MMC approved her hiring via email.

A request was made to send out the Messenger monthly as numerous members have requested that they want to receive information in a timelier manner. The suggestion is to email those that have email addresses. Those that do not will continue to receive a hard copy in the mail. The Messenger can also be accessed on PLC website.

A motion was made by Lynn to send out on a monthly basis to those that have email and if requested, a paper copy will be mailed. Kathy seconded the motion. Motion carried.

#### 4. Unfinished business:

- **a.** Office transition with Sue in the new position is ongoing. Kathy suggested a biography about Sue would be informative and it could be added to the others on the bulletin board. Creating a staff bulletin board is being considered.
- **b.** Guidance from MN South District: Names were given to PLC for vacancy pastors. The decision was made to contact one candidate. We are waiting to hear back from the candidate on their decision.
