Greetings from Pastor Joe Asher,

After four weeks of serving our Lord Jesus at Peace Lutheran Church, I can truly say it has been a joy to be with you this beautiful 2021 fall season. Since my home state is Indiana, where most of my family still lives, I have a lot to learn about Minnesota. So many members have stopped in to the church office to say "hello," and also clue me in to Minnesota winters, and important features of living in Hutchinson, also farming, and fishing, and so many other things too numerous to mention.

I've attended meetings and observed how Sunday school and Bible studies work at Peace. I've sat in as a table mentor in Confirmation, and I've visited members at home.

If there is a goal for my work in serving God here, and in my work for our church, it can be found in the following two Scripture passages.

2 Corinthians 4:16-18 (NIV)

16 Therefore we do not lose heart. Though outwardly we are wasting away, yet inwardly we are being renewed day by day. 17 For our light and momentary troubles are achieving for us an eternal glory that far outweighs them all. 18 So we fix our eyes not on what is seen, but on what is unseen, since what is seen is temporary, but what is unseen is eternal.

In this world with all the violence and conflict, and also with the recent conflict in church, it is easy to "lose heart" and forget about our Lord Jesus entirely. The problems and division seem too big for us and it becomes easy to dispair about what the future holds. Will we be able to solve the problems that plague us? It comes to the point where we are "wasting away" with worry.

But in the above passage, Paul reminds us all that there is a power in our lives which is "being renewed each day." That power is the presence of Christ in us, and the Holy Spirit who works in our lives. No matter what we face, we know that God is able to take our eyes off this fallen world, and return us to a close fellowship with our God, who renews us daily.

Hebrews 12:1-2

And let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us, fixing our eyes on Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith. For the joy set before him he endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God.

Eyes on Jesus! That is the way to live the life marked out for us! We must persevere, which can be defined as "gutting it out," or "hanging in there," as we run the race of our lives. But here is the good news-- it is God who supplies the power not only to finish the race, but also to win the crown of glory which He has prepared for those who love Him. And as the passage above explains, Jesus is in control. He is seated at the right hand of the heavenly Father.

May the peace of God which surpasses all understanding keep your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus. Amen



A Note to Confirmation Families:

Thank you parents for having your children in Confirmation! For most people, this will be the only opportunity of a lifetime to STUDY Christian theology and thereby strengthen their faith for this life and the next.

This month, we will be studying the Third Commandment which tells us to set aside one day each week for hearing the Word and worshiping with other Christians. Everyone who has been confirmed has promised to do this regularly. Our expectations are that families of confirmands will attend church regularly. In addition, students are expected to turn in 10 sermon notes per semester (5 for 6th Grade), and serve as acolytes, ushers, or sound technicians (which requires training) for about six services per year. Students are expected to do memory work including Books of the Bible, and Luther's Small Catechism. In these ways, we pray that they will joyfully serve God and prepare for a lifetime of faithful Christian living.

- 27-When pain gets the best of you, know the Holy Spirit is still with you. Jesus endured pain so we could be with Him someday.
- 28-Pray for our church staff and it's members.
- 29-Read James 3:5--"The tongue is a small thing but what enormous damage it can do." May your words about one another be ones that are spoken in the spirit of God's kindness.
