"Entering His Presence"

Matt. 2:11-12 ^{11"}On coming to the house, they saw the child with his mother Mary, and they bowed down and worshiped him. Then they opened their treasures and presented him with gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. ¹² And having been warned in a dream not to go back to Herod, they returned to their country by another route."

The long journey of the wise men is complete. They enter the house and see the young Child with His mother. They fall down before Him in joyous humility and present Him with their costly gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. Undoubtedly, Joseph will use these gifts to fund their unexpected escape to Egypt when Herod sends his soldiers to kill Jesus.

Our Advent journey is now complete, but our life journey is not. Today in the Christian church the Christmas season gives way to the Epiphany season. This new season stretches until Ash Wednesday and the season of Lent, when we turn our attention to the reason our Savior was born, the reason He walked among us, the reason He bore the name "Jesus." But today we anticipate the day our life's journey will come to its end. Then with exceeding joy and gladness we, like the wise men and the shepherds, will enter into the presence of our Lord, our Savior, our Creator, and our Brother. We will bow in sweet adoration, and rejoice in His glorious presence forever. We will hear the angels' adoration and rejoice with Jesus Christ, the Son of God and Son of Mary.

PRAYER: Lord Jesus, thank You for journeying through this life for us, and for journeying with us through our lives. Guide us safely home and keep us in joyful anticipation of entering Your presence forever. We pray in Your Holy Name. Amen.

Sunday School News

It's an exciting New Year for the Peace Lutheran Sunday School! We have begun using the "Enduring Faith"

curriculum, a program which teaches students more than 125 Bible stories in a 3-year cycle. Lessons spiral to help students go deeper each time they reencounter a Bible passage. In each lesson, students learn all about their Savior, Jesus Christ, and what He means for them. By Junior High, students explore how to defend their faith and how to teach the faith to others. Information is also sent home each week so that families can extend the lesson with activities and discussion during the week.

In January, students will explore the following Bible passages:

January 9 - Jesus Raises Lazarus

January 16 - Jesus Heals 10 Lepers

January 23 - Jesus Blesses the Children

January 30 - Mary Annoints Jesus

We are also excited to announce that students will begin a memory work program on January 9.

Each week a Bible verse will be sent home which connects to the lesson they have learned. They will recite the verse to their teachers the following week.

Why so much Bible in Peace Lutheran Church curriculum? The answer is found in Romans 10:17 - Consequently, faith comes from hearing the message, and the message is heard through the Word of Christ. Our goal is to strengthen the faith of our children and youth so that they are prepared for their lives ahead. This world is a fallen world, and more and more the culture attacks the Christian faith as useless. God's Word is truth. Jesus is the Word made flesh. So the Scriptures are crucial to our children's lives, and Baptism (and the Lord's Supper) help the children understand God's love and strength for each day.

Our Sunday School will also begin celebrating Baptismal Birthdays each month. Students will learn the hymn "God's Own Child I Gladly Say It" (LSB 594) and explore their identity as a child of God.

Call to Order - Opening prayer by Pastor Joe

1. Pastoral Care transition plan – Pastor Stefan Wismar, Executive Assistant to President Woodford:

Pastor Wismar gave an overview of intentional interim pastors (IIP) and their duties. Intentional interim pastors are trained to create stability within a congregation. They help to develop goals with the district. It is a called position. Their position is a minimum of 12 months and can last up to 18 months. They do not leave until a congregation has called a new pastor. Once a call has been accepted, the role becomes less from the intentional interim pastor. Pastor Wismar referred to Titus 1:5 in relationship to the role of a IIP. Pastor Wismar provided copies of an intentional interim ministry agreement for future use.

He shared that an IIP is completing his tenure within a month and may be available to consider a call in February. He recommended a call committee will be appointed to begin the process of hiring an IIP.

2. Pastor reports:

- a. Pastor James A summary of questionnaires/recommendations from Pastor James was reported and discussed. The information was compiled from surveys completed by council members, Board of Elders, and current and former members of the congregation.
- b. Pastor Joe Update on confirmation & Sunday School instruction: Pastor Joe is seeking help with an attendance spreadsheet to use in confirmation. Doug Brown agreed to help. Pastor Joe is hoping to visit each confirmation student's home to personally to connect with them. Pastor Joe shared confirmation guidelines which will be presented to confirmation students and families.

Sandy Kephart has resigned from her position. An exit interview was conducted with Sandy on November 16, 2021. Information regarding her resignation will be shared at the congregational meeting on November 21, 2021. Pastor Joe's wife, Jennie has volunteered to oversee the Sunday School program and the Christmas program. Doug made a motion to accept Jennie's offer to oversee the Sunday school and Christmas programs. Chuck 2nd the motion. Motion passed.

- 3. MMC meeting
- **a. Approval of minutes October 19, 2021**; Lynn made a motion to accept the minutes. 2nd by Heidi. Motion carried.

b. Reports:

1) Treasurer: Kevin shared a report of profit & loss from January through October 2021. Little Lambs is asking for an increase from \$4000 to \$5000 per month on the LLCC credit card to make payments through the end of each month. A request for a credit card for Sue to use in the office was also presented. The limit would be \$2000 / month on this card.

Chuck made a motion for a credit increase for LLCC and a credit card for Sue. 2nd by Kathy. Motion carried.

- A letter from the McLeod County assessor was receives regarding classification
 of the parsonage for tax purposes. Kevin volunteered to meet with Rhonda regarding this matter and report back.
- 2) Board of Elders: Doug asked if people of Mission & Ministry would be interested in attending a class on CPR. Doug will work with Shirley Wurdell to line up dates and a contact person. It will be offered to Elders, ushers, and staff member.

November 16, 2021 7 pm

- John shared that he volunteered to help with bible study along with Wayne
 Vinkemeier. If anyone would like to ring the Salvation Army bell at during the holiday season, please contact Mae Schuette.
- The Council asked the BOEs to share their plan of action to update our active roster of congregation members at the next council meeting.
- 3) LLCC report: Lynn reported flooring will be installed in a room Dec. 27. January 9 is the date for the 10-year celebration. A lunch will be offered. There is still an opening for school age children 's program; otherwise fully staffed. They are now open Fridays. A stabilization grant in the amount of \$4,913.70 was awarded to LLCC for the month of September.
- 4) Human Resources Committee
- a. Status of Director of Youth Ministry job posting: Currently, the job posting has been pulled down. The youth board will be approached to see if there is a volunteer to help. The idea about a possible paid position of 10 hours was discussed.
- b. Status of Christian Education Director & Outreach Coord., Operations Coord.: The HR committee recommended appointing a mission committee. Lynn agreed to draft a committed description for approval. This is being recommended to manage responsibilities following Sandy's departure.
- c. Event facility agreement policy: Lynn reported the form has been revised to facilitate accountability for scheduling and managing events. Motion to accept the updated form and collect damage deposit equal to rent charge made by: Kevin. 2nd by: Heidi. Motion carried.
- **d. Job description for a facilities manager** is being recommended by the HR committee. Lynn shared the job description. Motion made by Heidi for the description and to post the job. 2nd by Kathy. Motion carried.
- c. Unfinished business:
- 1) Finalize agenda for congregational meeting: The Council approved the following agenda:
- 1. Vote on approval of revisions to our Constitution and Bylaws
- 2. Pastoral care transition plan
- 3. Staff update

Status of Christian Edu. Director & Outreach Coord., Operations Coord.

Lynn made a motion to include in the discussion of pastoral care transition plan a request the congregation vote to approve the appointment of a IIP call committee, 2nd by Shirley. Motion carried.

- 2) Outreach for new members: Pastor Joe has reached out to some who have shown interest in membership.
- d. New Business:
- 1) Annual Voters' Assembly will be January 30, 2022.
- 2) Nominations committee: Jeff W will return and will need 2/3 vote approval; Matt will need 2/3 approval if he decides to serve. At large will be open. Shirley will run for a 2-year term for an at large member. Lynn will run for vice president. Kathy will run for an at large member. Bob will not be seeking re-election.
- 3) Rekeying the church was discussed.
- 7. Adjournment Closing prayer by James Fuchs.

Meeting adjourned at 10:30 p.m.

Congregational Meeting Minutes November 21, 2021 - Peace Center

Meeting called to order at 11:40 a.m. Opening prayer by Pastor Fuchs.

1. Vote on approval of revisions to Constitution & Bylaws:

Bob provided background information prior to the vote to approve the recommended changes to our Constitution & Bylaws. They were last reviewed 13 years ago. The benefits of reviewing them with each incoming Church Council and BOEs was discussed.

- Notable revisions include changing the name of the Mission and Ministry Council to Church Council or Council. The powers and duties of the Mission & Ministry Council are unchanged. The age requirement for voting age was removed.
- Discussion included reminding members that the Council meetings are open to the congregation. Please notify the Council President in advance if you have a topic for the agenda. If there is a human resources item, that portion of the meeting will be closed to congregation members due to confidentiality requirements.
- Discussion about eliminating the term "male" in Article 12 of the Bylaws was suggested. Pastor Asher and Fuchs both recommended this be tabled for now, to focus on the issues PLC is addressing currently.
- It was agreed the leadership also consider revision of language addressing the requirement to mail out suggested revisions (Const. -Article IX Amendments); the age of voting members (Bylaws - Article 3 Voting Membership)
- It was suggested the words "if requested" could be added regarding members receiving a copy of the Constitution & Bylaws via mail.
- Sarah Peterson made a motion to approve the suggested revisions to the Constitution & Bylaws; 2nd by George Moehring. All voted aye with one opposed. Motion carried.

After further consideration, the revised document will be sent to the District for approval as required.

2. Pastoral Care Transition Plan: Bob explained that Pastor Stefan Wismar, Executive Assistant to President Woodford attended a joint meeting of the Council and BOEs to inform them that there is a IIP candidate who may be available to accept a call in February. Pastor Fuchs explained the role of an Intentional Interim Pastor (IIP). A call committee will be appointed by the Council to proceed in reviewing this and any other candidates. The committee will consist of 7 people with no more than 2 being from the Council. Any member can nominate

themselves or another member by submitting the name(s) to Bob. George Moehring made a motion to create a call committee for an IIP. 2nd by Ed Homan. Motion carried.

3. Update on Director of Youth Ministry: Lynn reported that the Elders and the Council met on November 8 with Sean Martens from the synod office. He provides assistance calling education and commissioned ministers. President Woodford is directing PLC to defer the process of calling a Director of Christian Education (DCE) until an IIP is in place. Sean's suggestion was to find a DCE that could assist on a limited term. He provided the names of 5 people including Jennie Asher (Pastor Asher's wife) who might consider assisting us. Sean suggested using volunteers as the other individuals would possibly be able to provide limited time and be more of a consultant rather than providing programming.

4. Update on Christian Education Director & Outreach Coordinator/ Operations Coordinator:

Plans for maintaining Sunday School, youth programming, and mission efforts following Sandy Kephart's resignation were discussed.

The Human Resources Committee revised the Mission Committee job description and recommended reactivating this committee. It was not approved at the November council meeting but will likely be on the December agenda and be approved at that time.

The operations component will be filled by a facilities manager. It will be part time position. It is posted on PLC website, in the bulletin, and will be in the Messenger. Closing date is December 1 but will interview sooner if there is a qualified candidate.

The Council approved Jennie Asher to oversee Sunday School and the Christmas program as a volunteer. Heather Pagel will teach release time. The remaining children ministry/youth programs are being reviewed. Sunday school teachers and available board members will meet Monday, November 22. Pastor Asher and Jennie recommend using curriculum published by Concordia Publishing House for Sunday School instruction. Consideration will be given to hiring a part time person to oversee the other Christian education programs.

Closing prayer by Pastor Asher. Meeting adjourned at 12:25 p.m.

- Feb 28 We pray for Peace Church that God would work in our hearts, to unite together as on in Christ. "Praise God to whom all Blessings Flow!"


