A Message from Pastor James Fuchs



On Tuesday, April 5, I was given the assignment at the Administrative Meeting – no the opportunity – to write an Article for the Peace Messenger. In one way I was quite surprised at this opportunity, as my time at Peace Lutheran is winding down with the acceptance of the Call by Pastor Glenn Meyer to serve Peace as its Intentional Interim Minister. I am confident Pastor Meyer will serve you well and you will receive him in the spirit of God's Grace. I want to thank you for the welcoming consideration shown me and it has been most gratefully appreciated.

As I am winding down I want to be clear that I believe Peace Lutheran has made a number of changes that will add to the strength of the congregation; but, with that said, there are several other things that must be done. My prayer for Peace Lutheran is that it continues to address the areas that need addressing and build upon its strengths.

I have made the following observations:

- 1. Significant progress has been made in the Confirmation Program thanks to Pastor Asher and it was a challenging task. It was not easy and there were many tough situations that had to be addressed, but with the guidance and direction of the Holy Spirit we made it through: All the students will be confirmed because they stepped up to the plate following the Holy Spirit's call to them and their parents.
- 2. I have noticed a beginning of softer communication between individuals who have differing viewpoints. Yes, they may still argue but the speech is less personal and if it does become rough I have seen people going back to that person apologizing and repenting. Hopefully this will continue and become more the norm that people actually stop and truly listen to what the other person is saying and in the process seeking clarity of the issue at hand.
- 3. There are other things as well which I cannot mention as not to break confidentiality. All one has to do is truly be open to what is occurring and taking positive corrective action as well. Though communication is more positive there is still room for improvement. With the above positive things stated there are some critical issues that need to be addressed and the foundation for some of them of are being put into place at this time. I am confident that Pastor Meyer will continue the work in the following areas:
- 1. Adult Bible Study/Sunday School is critical. Study after study has shown that if there is not significant attendance of adults, especially males, in these programs and involved in studying Scripture the Congregation suffers significantly and will not grow.
- 2. All one has to do is look at the people attending any of the worship services. It is readily apparent there are few people between the ages of 25 to 60 attending the services. If children are at Sunday school they are apparently dropped off as one does not see many parents and high school age young adults attending worship services. This is a serious concern as Peace is top heavy with senior citizens and their numbers are dwindling and the youth are not there. This means everyone, yes everyone, must immediately become active in inviting people back to worship.
- 3. When a decision has been reached by the various leadership groups within the Congregation these decisions must be actively supported by all, especially by the individuals in the leadership group that made the decision. Going around the group's decision to undermine the decision that was made must stop immediately as all it does is it destroys the credibility of

4. When problems are identified they must be addressed to resolve them; and not by the process of "if we wish them to go away, they will go away" – or – "if we ignore them, they will take care of themselves". This sadly has been the process many times used in the past only creating bigger problems rather than solving them.

There are many great people who belong to Peace Lutheran who want the Congregation to grow and prosper in proclaiming the message of Salvation given to us by the Death and Resurrection of Jesus Christ. I invite you to move out of your comfort zone, just like sitting towards the front of the sanctuary instead of the back, and actively become missionaries within your families, your congregation and community to promote Christ. This is critical for Peace Lutheran to grow and prosper. I want to assure you that even when I am no longer with you I will be praying for you. Thank you for listening to me when many times I felt it necessary to be extremely candid with you.

May God continue to richly bless you and Peace Lutheran Church.

Why is Adult Bible Study So Important? by Pastor Asher

By now you may have heard that the pastors (Fuchs and Asher) have asked the elders to recommend to Council that we open up a Sunday morning time slot for adult Bible study. The unfortunate thing is that to re-emphasize adult Christian growth (which Peace Lutheran Church used to have in the past), we had to make a change in our current worship schedule. This decision was a difficult one to make for our Board of Elders and Council,



and pastors, too. It took three meetings for the elders, and it was hoped that after prayer, the board would have a unanimous decision. Eventually we got to a unanimous vote, but not without long and serious discussion on why we needed change, and what that change would look like. And if you've not heard, the decision was made by the elders (with the Council) to open the 9:15- 10:15am time slot for Peace Center adult Bible study, with contemporary worship moved to 10:30- 11:30am in the Peace Center. This change will take effect on 9/11/22.

As your vacancy pastor, I lobbied hard for our church to get our adults back into God's Word on Sunday mornings. I've been a teacher all my life, and I've always believed that the strength of a growing congregation is seen in its adult Bible classes. Whether I was on the mission field or in "the States," I always wanted our Sunday school children to walk by the adult classes on their way to their own Bible lessons. Why? Because the grade school and high school youth needed to see the adults modeling a life of growing faith and Christian maturity. They needed to see that Jesus and God's Word was as important to their parents and "grown-ups" as it was to them.

What is it about the Word of God which is so important to faith? For Lutheran Christians, the answer is very simple. The Word and Sacraments are for us the "Means of Grace." Let's focus on God's Word. Through the Scriptures, the Holy Spirit deepens faith and connects us to Jesus Christ. In our Church, Romans 10:17 has always been of immense importance-

17 Consequently, faith comes from hearing the message, and the message is heard through the word about Christ.

You want more faith? Spend time in the Word in personal devotions. You want more faith? Hear the Word preached. Also, you can join a Bible study and really learn something about the Lord and faith, and the Holy Spirit will deepen your love for Christ. God's Word is powerful. It changes lives. If you read Acts 2, Peter preached a sermon about the people's rejection of Christ and His resurrection, and then in the power of the Holy Spirit, this message led people to repentance and faith with the result that around 3000 became Christians. And this result from God's powerful Word doesn't just happen in "ancient history" or the pages of the Bible. As a prison chaplain, I've seen murderers and drug dealers come to faith in the Savior over the span of my ministry. And even today, Peace Lutheran's confirmation youth are responding to God's Word as the Holy Spirit shows them that they absolutely need God in their lives.

Deuteronomy 6:4-7 is also important as we think about the study of God's Word in our lives-

"Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one. 5 Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength. 6 These commandments that I give you today are to be on your hearts. 7 Impress them on your children. Talk about them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up."

At Peace Lutheran Church, we need to get back to the basics. Loving God and following Christ as His disciple begins with being in the Word, knowing God's Word, following God's Word, and in the power of the Holy Spirit loving and following Jesus as Lord.



LLCC received a \$25,000 donation from Prince Of Peace and \$25,000 donation from the Congregational fund.

C. Treasurer's Report:

Financial Budget: Down approximately \$18,000. LLCC Budget: Numbers are solid through February.

Discussion regarding wage adjustments, health care cuts and grants for LLCC and PLC employees.

Refinance: Researching possible refinance for long term debt with Lutheran Church Extension Fund (LCEF). Rate offered to PLC is a locked rate of 3.75% for 7 years from LCEF.
