This week's **Sunday School** lesson tells of ten terrible plagues and how Pharaoh relents and releases the Israelites to worship in the wilderness. Realizing the Israelites have no intention of returning, Pharaoh's army pursues the runaways. Caught between Pharaoh's charioteers and the waters of the Red Sea, the people cry out to God. Moses stretches his hand over the sea as God parts the waters, enabling the people to pass through the sea on dry ground. As Egypt's army attempts to follow, the sea closes in over them, so no one survives. God also rescues us—from sin, death, and the devil through our Lord Jesus Christ. Read the whole account in Exodus 14. This week's **memory verse** is: "Call upon Me in the day of trouble; I will deliver you." Psalm 50:15

High School Bible Class—LESSON FOCUS: In a large degree, young people experience a put-down culture in which insults are cool and kindness is not. They may believe that scoring points at the expense of another's feelings is no big deal—that it doesn't really mean anything. When pressed, however, most will admit that even the small digs sometimes hurt and that teasing and unkind words can easily build up to become a serious offense. GOSPEL FOCUS: God calls on His children to support and build one another up. By God's grace we have forgiveness as we repent of our sinful words and actions. Christ's love empowers us to plant seeds of kindness.

To Peace Lutheran Church Congregation,

The purpose of this letter is to inform you that a Nominating Committee has been seated and we are beginning the work of establishing the slate of candidates who will run for open seats on the Church Council and the Board of Elders. All elected positions serve two-year terms. The election will be held at the annual Voter's/Congregational Meeting in January 2023. The actual date for the meeting will be posted once it has been set.

The Church Council consists of a total of nine members; four officers, and five at large council members. The church council is the governing body of the Peace Lutheran Church congregation. The Church Council has the authority to enforce the Constitution and Bylaws, and develops policies as required to execute the goals approved by the Congregation. There are four Church Council seats up for election this year. They are as follows: Secretary, Treasurer, and two At-Large seats.

The Board of Elders consists of ten male members of the Congregation who serve staggered two-year terms. The Board of Elders elects their own president and secretary. The Board of Elders nurtures and encourages the spiritual growth of the Congregation and supervises, advises and assists the pastors in worship, preaching, congregational care, administration of the sacraments, and church discipline.

Changes to the makeup of the Board of Elders over recent years had resulted in the terms of service for some of the members of the Board of Elders to become out of sync with the PLC Bylaws. The Nominating Committee has addressed this issue. As a result, there are eight seats on the Board of Elders up for election this year. Three of those seats will have one-year terms, which will allow for five open seats beginning January 2024. At that point the Board of Elders terms of service will once again be compliant with the PLC Bylaws. Given that the Board of Elders elects its own officers, all seats up for election are at large seats.

The Nominating Committee asks you to prayerfully consider serving PLC in an elected capacity. If you are interested in doing so, please contact a member of the committee to express your interest.
