Lighting the Advent and Christ Candles - Broll Family

We gather together this morning to celebrate the birth of God's one and only Son: Jesus, Emmanuel, Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.

Where there is despair, Jesus brings us hope—the hope of Christmas. Psalm 33:20 "We wait in hope for the LORD; he is our help and our shield." As we gather to worship: **We light the candle of HOPE.** (Light a blue candle.)

Where there is war and discord, Jesus brings us peace—the peace of Christmas. Psalm 29:11 "The Lord gives strength to His people; the Lord blesses His people with peace."

As we gather to worship: We light the candle of PEACE. (Light a blue candle.)

Where there is sorrow, Jesus brings us joy—the Joy of Christmas. Philippians 4:4 "Rejoice in the Lord always, again I say, rejoice!" As we gather to worship: **We light the candle of JOY.** (Light the pink candle.)

Where there is despair, Jesus brings us love—the love of Christmas. John 3:16 "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have eternal life."

As we gather to worship: We light the candle of LOVE. (Light a blue candle.)

Where there is darkness, Jesus brings us light—the light of Christmas. John 8:12 Jesus spoke to them, saying, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life." As we gather to worship: **We light the Christ Candle.**

Jesus is the light of the world! (Light the Christ candle.)

Almighty God, have mercy upon us, forgive us our sins, and lead us to everlasting life. Amen.



⁷ How beautiful on the mountains are the feet of those who bring good news, who proclaim peace, who bring good tidings, who proclaim salvation, who say to Zion, "Your God reigns!"
⁸ Listen! Your watchmen lift up their voices; together they shout for joy.
When the LORD returns to Zion, they will see it with their own eyes.

⁹ Burst into songs of joy together,
you ruins of Jerusalem,
for the LORD has comforted his people,
he has redeemed Jerusalem.
 ¹⁰ The LORD will lay bare his holy arm
in the sight of all the nations,
and all the ends of the earth will see
the salvation of our God. (NIV)

EPISTLE READING: Hebrews 1:1-6

In the past God spoke to our ancestors through the prophets at many times and in various ways, ² but in these last days he has spoken to us by his Son, whom he appointed heir of all things, and through whom also he made the universe.

³ The Son is the radiance of God's glory and the exact representation of his being, sustaining all things by his powerful word.

After he had provided purification for sins, he sat down at the right hand of the Majesty in heaven. ⁴ So he became as much superior to the angels as the name he has inherited is superior to theirs.

⁵ For to which of the angels did God ever say,

"You are my Son; today I have become your Father"?
Or again, "I will be his Father, and he will be my Son"?
And again, when God brings his firstborn into the world, he says,
"Let all God's angels worship him." (NIV)
This is the Word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.

GOSPEL READING: John 1:1-14

The Holy Gospel according to St. John, the 1st chapter. **Glory to You, O Lord.** In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. ² He was with God in the beginning. ³ Through him all things were made; without him nothing was made that has been made. ⁴ In him was life, and that life was the light of all mankind. ⁵ The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.

⁶ There was a man sent from God whose name was John. ⁷ He came as a witness to testify concerning that light, so that through him all might believe. ⁸ He himself was not the light; he came only as a witness to the light.

⁹ The true light that gives light to everyone was coming into the world. ¹⁰ He was in the world, and though the world was made through him, the world did not recognize him. ¹¹ He came to that which was his own, but his own did not receive him. ¹² Yet to all who did receive him, to those who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God—¹³ children born not of natural descent, nor of human decision or a husband's will, but born of God.

¹⁴ The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us. We have seen his glory, the glory of the one and only Son, who came from the Father, full of grace and truth. (NIV)

This is the Gospel of the Lord. **Praise to You, O Christ.**
