Lighting the Advent Candles and the Christ Candle

5:00 McKimm family; 7:00pm Peterson family; 9:00pm Pfau family

We gather together on this holy night to celebrate the birth of God's one and only Son: Jesus, Emmanuel, Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.

Where there is despair, Jesus brings us hope—the hope of Christmas. Psalm 33:20 "We wait in hope for the LORD; he is our help and our shield."

As we gather to worship: We light the candle of HOPE.

Where there is war and discord, Jesus brings us peace—the peace of Christmas. Psalm 29:11 "The Lord gives strength to His people; the Lord blesses His people with peace."

As we gather to worship: We light the candle of PEACE. (Light a blue candle.)

Where there is sorrow, Jesus brings us joy—the Joy of Christmas. Philippians 4:4 "Rejoice in the Lord always, again I say, rejoice!"

As we gather to worship: We light the candle of JOY. (Light the pink candle.)

Where there is despair, Jesus brings us love—the love of Christmas. John 3:16 "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have eternal life."

As we gather to worship: We light the candle of LOVE. (Light a blue candle.)

Where there is darkness, Jesus brings us light—the light of Christmas. John 8:12 Jesus spoke to them, saying, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life."

As we gather to worship:

We light the Christ Candle. Jesus is the light of the world! (Light the Christ candle.)

OLD TESTAMENT READING: Isaiah 7:10-14

 10 Again the LORD spoke to Ahaz, 11 "Ask the LORD your God for a sign, whether in the deepest depths or in the highest heights."

12 But Ahaz said, "I will not ask; I will not put the LORD to the test."

¹³ Then Isaiah said, "Hear now, you house of David! Is it not enough to try the patience of humans? Will you try the patience of my God also? ¹⁴ Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign: The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and will call him Immanuel. This is the Word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God!**

EPISTLE READING: 1 John 4:7-16

⁷ Dear friends, let us love one another, for love comes from God. Everyone who loves has been born of God and knows God. ⁸ Whoever does not love does not know God, because God is love. ⁹ This is how God showed his love among us: He sent his one and only Son into the world that we might live through him. ¹⁰ This is love: not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins. ¹¹ Dear friends, since God so loved us, we also ought to love one another. ¹² No one has ever seen God; but if we love one another, God lives in us and his love is made complete in us.

¹³ This is how we know that we live in him and he in us: He has given us of his Spirit. ¹⁴ And we have seen and testify that the Father has sent his Son to be the Savior of the world. ¹⁵ If anyone acknowledges that Jesus is the Son of God, God lives in them and they in God. ¹⁶ And so we know and rely on the love God has for us. (NIV)

GOSPEL READING: Matthew 1:18-25

The Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew, the 1st chapter. Glory to You, O Lord.

¹⁸ This is how the birth of Jesus the Messiah came about: His mother Mary was pledged to be married to Joseph, but before they came together, she was found to be pregnant through the Holy Spirit. ¹⁹ Because Joseph her husband was faithful to the law, and yet did not want to expose her to public disgrace, he had in mind to divorce her quietly.

²⁰ But after he had considered this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary home as your wife, because what is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. ²¹ She will give birth to a son, and you are to give him the name Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins."

²² All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had said through the prophet: ²³ "The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and they will call him Immanuel" (which means "God with us").

²⁴ When Joseph woke up, he did what the angel of the Lord had commanded him and took Mary home as his wife. ²⁵ But he did not consummate their marriage until she gave birth to a son. And he gave him the name Jesus. (NIV)

This is the Gospel of the Lord. Praise to You, O Christ.
