

### A Message from our Pastor: Rev Glenn Meyer, IIM

Dear Members & Friends of Peace Lutheran Church:

I have learned from my wife Sue to often say, "God is good!.... All the time!.... All the time!..... God is good!" I think of Romans 8:28 (NIV) "And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love Him, who have been called according to His purpose."

I have been serving as your Intentional Interim Pastor (IIM) since August, 2022. We have faced challenges this year, we have made mistakes, and we have experienced some amazing blessings. I thank God for the many excellent people of faith whom I have come to already know here at Peace and in the Hutch area. God continues to be at work among and through us as His people of faith.

### Some things in process:

- 1. Setting up the Interim Task Force (ITF) who will start meeting in February.
- [As shared at our Fireside Chats (close to 170 members & friends of Peace were part of this effort) the ITF will process all the notes gathered and will seek additional information from various sources. They will put together a report about Peace Lutheran: our strengths, weaknesses, issues identified, what has been done, is being planned, still needs to be addressed, opportunities for ministry, and what we think our key signature ministries should be going forward in Christ! They will share their report with the congregation in a Town Hall meeting here at church, possibly late April. If accepted by the congregation, this report will start our call process with district.]
- 2. The staff and a couple of volunteers have put together an application for a DCE Intern. We are hopeful for a positive reception. We were also told that there are twice as many applications as interns. "The harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few, beseech the Lord of the harvest to send out workers!"
- 3. We have a team working on finding a way to restart our preschool & childcare ministries in a viable, sustainable manner. (Watch for reports.)
- 4. We made some efforts to sell or rent our Peace Place to a Christian ministry this does not appear to currently be an option. We are taking the approach to accept Peace Place as a resource from God to be used in ministry.
- 5. Working to expand Junior Youth & Senior Youth ministry efforts.

  I and other volunteers are working to be able to meet with parents & youth in finding ways to reopen the Peace Place and also in other ways to expand our youth fellowship, involvement, Bible Class & mission opportunities.
- 6. Working to have a God-pleasing Ministry Financial Support Plan (budget). We are committed to having a balanced, sustainable, detailed support plan that will never spend what doesn't need to be spent, support our staff, and maintains our commitments to missions.
- 7. Have started our 'Debt Free in 7 Years Initiative'. We have paid off much of our building debt, (over half?) but need to now finish paying off the remaining debt from the remodeling, elevator, sprinkler system additions we made in the Berg Center (current debt: \$2,280,000). [We need to average about \$28,000 per month towards principal.] (Watch for exciting updates on this effort.) Our general ministry support budget covers the interest costs.
- 8. We attempted a Stewardship & Commitment Sunday effort in November. Many chose not to sign their commitments, so it did not inform the church budget process for 2023. However, it did have a positive impact on leading people to prayerfully consider all their financial blessings and respond with first-fruit giving, tithes, and offerings of thanks and praise to God. Our costs are being watched closely. Our giving appears to be on a growing trend.
- 9. We managed to set aside \$50,000 as a General Reserve Fund (at the end of the year) that will be kept for those rare instances where we may need help with cash flow. We will maintain this reserve fund, replenish it from our General Fund if/when necessary after Easter & after December 31 of each year. In this way we hope to never have to use our Line of Credit with the bank and this will help us keep our pledge to never borrow from designated funds.
- 10. Pastor Bode is teaching Bible Class in the Peace Center Sunday mornings. Pastor Asher is teaching a class in the Berg Center on Sundays through May. We are thrilled to see so many adults attending Bible Class on Sunday and throughout the week. Come and join us!

- 11. We rejoice in again seeing more children in Sunday School and are making efforts to encourage and welcome more and more of these children, with their parents, at our weekend worship services.
- 12. The importance of us returning to and staying focused on the mission of Peace: "We are a loving community, called by God's grace that all may know the peace of God."

As I hope you can see, there are a lot of things happening. At so many levels we see God's hand of guidance and blessing, and we rejoice and praise God!

In all things, we seek to honor God, support and expand His kingdom work, and encourage and show compassion to our fellow Christians, starting with our own families and our household of faith here at Peace Lutheran.

We are working hard to have a culture of love, care, compassion and kindness going forward which will be exhibited by all members, leaders and staff! Yes, we will deal with whatever needs to be dealt with. Yes, we will trust the entire congregation with details of financial support for ministry, budgets, and ministry concerns. We will not allow any to 'lord it over others' but will instead encourage servant leadership. We have seen the importance of recognizing our fellow Christians as members of the Body of Christ. People who are to be accepted and valued for their thoughts, gifts and insights to the ministry we all share in Christ!

Not one of us has all the answers. But, together, God has given us the various gifts, insights, talents and resources to do all that He has called us to do.

Yes, it takes true love for the Lord! It takes total commitment and a willingness to maintain our Lord Jesus as Lord of ALL of our life! It's not easy, but it is so worth it! I'm in, totally! – What say you? Let's experience together what God has in mind for Peace Lutheran this coming year, and for the years to come. Let's set a good and secure foundation in Christ, maintain a culture of love and respect, and a profound desire, in ALL things, 'Not my will, but God's will be done!'

### A Message from Congregation President

2022 has been a very interesting year to say the very least; the church Council made some hard business decisions that needed to be addressed, none of which were taken lightly. I would very much like to thank Pastors Asher and Fuchs for their help during this time of transition, until PLC could call Intentional Interim Minister Glenn Meyer, to help navigate the church through this difficult time of healing.

The following are some of PLC Council's activities. Provide Council minutes to the congregation faster. Council has changed the monthly meeting date to facilitate this endeavor so that information can be available to the congregation in a timely manner. Once again, the Messenger is on a monthly basis according to PLC policy instead of every other month. An organizational structure chart was completed by the establishment of a flow chart detailing operations. This linear chart shows how communications(operations) flows between the congregation to the Council, the Council to Boards, staff and committees as well as the operational flow with staff reporting to the appropriate person in the chain of command. We are in the process of getting a current orientation manual in place for the Council and its new members, a policy manual updated so staff has the needed information at the ready to keep confusion to a minimum when questions arise. The Council is taking the initial steps of investigating the possibility of a DCE hire. The Council is building a solid foundation for the future so PLC operates in most effective and efficient manner as possible. We are entering a period which I will call "reset phase" or "new beginning" where PLC will be entering into the process of calling a new minister.

I, as Council President and as a member of Peace Lutheran Church, would very much like to encourage members to step forward and use your gifts and talents to serve God. We all have an opportunity to reach out and touch lives, with family, at work, in the community at large or wherever you may be at any given time. For those of you not attending on a regular basis, I personally invite you to attend PLC worship services and explore our education opportunities offered to all adults and children. Come, join us in celebrating the Good News of Jesus Christ.

This summer, Pastor Meyer, the church council and Elders adopted a new worship schedule for Peace. Worship service times were changed to Saturday at 6:30pm, and Sundays at 8:30am in the Sanctuary and 10:30am in the Peace Center, with a Pastor's Bible Study at 9:30am (Pastor Meyer 9:40-10:20am). Additional meetings will take place this spring to determine the 2023 summer schedule.

Additional worship services include: Advent and Lent (11:30am and 6:30pm), a Children's Christmas Service, Christmas Eve and Christmas Day, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, Easter, Thanksgiving Eve, Thanksgiving Day, Funerals, Baptisms and Weddings.

2022 was our 36th year of Summer Concerts at Peace. This series remains very popular and features area musicians. We are grateful to Delores Reiner and Jacquelyn Dixon and the many kitchen volunteers who provided the terrific meals which support these programs. As we look toward 2023, we are looking at changing the concert start time to 11:30am with a 12:15pm lunch. This will match our Advent and Lenten times, and provide the ensembles with more time for their performances. Programs run from the last Wednesday in June through the first Wednesday in August.

### **Visitation Ministry**

In September I completed twenty-two years of Visitation Ministry here at Peace. Other than the Covid scenario and occasional weather-related issue I have been able to do the ministry each month. It continues to be rewarding to me, and from the feedback I receive from the individuals and institutions I visit it is very rewarding and comforting for them as well. The facilities I visit are always ready for me having the individuals gathered as appropriate, and the people living at home always



have the doors unlocked ready for me to come in. I greet them and check with them if there is anything new I need to know, do my devotion followed by the communion setting, have a closing prayer adapted to their concerns, close with a blessing, leaving a sheet with a hymn verse or Bible verse and my next visit day and time filled in as well as a church bulletin. Quarterly I distribute Portals of Prayer. This past December I also distributed nearly 100 bags of cookies prepared by some parish members and Christmas cards made by some young people in the parish. The people were delighted. The numbers are down at some of the facilities due to Covid, deaths and related issues, but the number of stops I make remains about the same. This past year I have visited in Hopkins, Glencoe, Buffalo Lake, Brownton, Gaylord, Dassel, St. Louis Park, Waconia, and of course Hutchinson. My visits are usually made the week of the month with the third Thursday. Also I have done several funerals as requested. I do feel very blessed to have opportunity to do this ministry to help people find joy in living the latter years of their lives and helping them to have peace in their hearts and minds for dying.

It has been an exciting year in Children's Ministries. It has been an absolute joy to see all the smiling faces in Sunday School each week. We want to thank each parent for bringing your child to God's house to grow their faith, learn God's word and to know they will always have a safe place to go and people that love them. We have been enjoying the Enduring Faith Curriculum. Each class has been working on the same message each week, in hopes that when you have your family time at home your children can each be talking about the same lesson and what they have learned.

In Early Childhood Ministries (3 yr-Kindergarten) we are averaging 16 children each week which is wonderful. We are learning some tradition songs i.e. "This little Light of Mine", "Jesus Loves Me", "My God is so Big", to newer songs like, "The Bible is a



Treasure", "Hosanna Rock", and "Peace like a River". We will continue to introduce new fun songs each month. We also have a continuous Scrabble board going in our room that hangs on the South wall. We add one important word from each week's lesson to it and recap the entire board at the end of each month. The kids sure have been enjoying this game. We keep thinking of new crafts and fun activities to do with them each week with the reassurance that God will always love them, God will always keep his promises, God will always listen and will always forgive. The Christmas program was a huge hit and I may be a little bias, but I think our little kiddos out sang the big kids.

New this year, I and a small group of amazing ladies have banded together to try and have a Family Day each month or at least through the school year. It will be the last Saturday of each month starting in January. Our first event is a twist on a drive-in movie. We are asking parents to bring a laundry basket for their child(ren) that they can fit in and we well decorate it into a car. They will then sit in their 'car' for the movie. The adults and older children will then sit or lay on the blanket they have brought and everyone can enjoy popcorn, boxed candy and a drink. We will be watching the movie "The Star". February, will be "Spread Love". They will have the option to decorate cut out cookies, make cards or make a couple bracelets. They can make one for themselves, but then they have to make one to give to someone else to 'Spread Love' and joy that this world has to offer. March, we are looking to do a Family Game Day, where we 'check our phones at the door as they say and enjoy good old fashion board games, and card games. April, we hope to do another movie. For the rest of the year stay tuned to the newsletter, Messenger, and/or the bulletins for fun family events.

I would also like to extend a HUGE THANK YOU to all our families and friends here at Peace for being patient with us in getting our Children's Ministries figured out. I'll be the first to admit that we don't have all figured out but, with God's help, TOGETHER we will carry out His mission for Peace. I also want to give a HUGE THANK YOU to all the helpers, teachers, Dr Joan and Paul Otto for Music and to many subs that help make our Children's Ministries a success. ### Sunday School

The goal of Peace Lutheran's Sunday School is that each child will know that Jesus died and rose again to give him/her eternal life with Him in heaven. For the 2021-2022 academic year, six classes were offered (Preschool/Kindergarten, Grades 1-2, Grade 3, Grade 4, Grade 5, and Grades 6-8). We had an average attendance of 47 children per week. In August, family names were divided among the teachers and every family was telephoned and invited to attend Sunday School. With the help of Chuck and Michelle Jones we also contacted every high school student to invite them to a new class that was offered just for them. For the 2022-2023 academic year the senior high class was added and average attendance for all classes through December was 56 students. Students not attending are sent "Miss You" cards and families are emailed or telephoned.

We thank God for our dedicated teachers and assistants: Melissa Kohls, James and Tricia Merkins, Jen Mueller, Keith Anderson, Sadie Jenkins, Nevaeh Nass, Barb Otte, Lori and Kevin Buss, Darlyn Egge, Lynn Brown, Tammy Jelkin, Amanda Kaping, Margo Kaping, Heidi Sickmann, and Chuck and Michelle Jones. We also thank Dr. Joan for assisting with music.

We continue to use the "Enduring Faith Curriculum" by Concordia Publishing House (the LCMS Publishing House). We are completing an overview of major Old Testament accounts and will begin the New Testament in March 2023. Baptism birthdays are recognized on the first Sunday of each month. A small gift, including a candle, is sent home so that the child's family can celebrate the day he became a child of God. We also continue to learn a Bible memory verse each week related to the lesson of the week. The children are also learning verses and Biblical truths through music, and they share one of their songs each month during a worship service.

In September 2022 the children selected a mission project to help others learn about Jesus. Offerings will be sent to the LCMS to help build a tin roof for a church in Africa. At the time of this report, the children have contributed nearly \$300 toward a roof.

More than 60 students (grades Preschool through 8th grade) participated in the Children's Christmas Service, "A Promise Kept". The children told prophesies about Christ and shared the story of His birth. We thank Dr. Dixon for all of her help with music, and Jacquelyn Dixon for making our costumes. Recognizing that fellowship opportunities are needed at a young age, we offered a pizza party after a Saturday morning rehearsal the day before the service. Thanks to Tammy Jelkin's coordination and the help of 14 parents a great time was had by all!

Thank you for giving me the privilege of coordinating the efforts to share God's love and the Good News of Jesus with the children of Peace. I pray that the children, their families, and the teachers may grow closer to Christ their Savior!

### **Vacation Bible School**

Vacation Bible School was held at Peace June 13-17, 2022 for students age 3 through grade 5, with students in grades 6-12 serving as helpers. The theme was "God's Wonder Lab", and the children explored Science experiments as well as Bible lessons, sang Scripture verses and songs that spoke of Jesus's love, had Christian fellowship, and witnessed adults and youth modeling a life of faith and service in Christ. With each lesson the children learned a Bible memory verse (set to music). We had an average attendance of 40 children each day along with more than 40 teachers and helpers participating on some or all of the days.

We were challenged with a lack of volunteers for pre-VBS activities such as decorating and set up. It may be beneficial to consider having an evening VBS in the future (Sunday through Thursday evenings with a 5:30 meal and lessons/activities for ALL ages from 6:00-8:30) to meet the challenges of staffing as well as conflicts with children's summer activities (e.g., swimming lessons, sports camps). We were blessed with many members contributing supplies and snacks.

Thanks to the expertise of Chuck Jones, we implemented new security procedures this year, including managing drop-off/pick-up traffic and having a security team walk the perimeter of the building as well as monitoring visitors to the building while children were present.

A huge "thank you" to Lisa Kirchoff for her assistance in planning, managing registrations, decorating, and pitching in wherever needed!

- New this year is coffee and treats in Peace Center between services and during Bible Study.
- Taxi service is available for all worship services. Members call the taxi to arrange what is best for them. More independence and flexibility for individuals.
- Red Cross Bloodmobile is on the second Tuesday each month. We have new volunteers from Peace and also from the community. We average 130-140 units per month.
- CPR classes taught by John Arlt were offered to staff, ushers and leaders in February. We provide first aid kits and AED for the church building.
- Driver safety programs through Minnesota Department of Transportation are provided about every 6 weeks for members and the community, provides discount on insurance and makes safer drivers. 10 Drivers Discount classes were held in 2022 with a total of 182 participants.
- We began supplying personal care items in the women's restrooms and also provide personal size tissues for worship serves.
