From Pastor's Desk: "Serve One Another"

"Above all, keep loving one another earnestly, since love covers a multitude of sins. Show hospitality to one another without grumbling. As each has received a gift, use it to serve one another, as good stewards of God's varied grace: in order that in everything God may be glorified through Christ Jesus."

"How can I help you?" Such a greeting is often heard in a store set up to serve the needs of their customer. At least, this was often the case in years past. Now, I think it is becoming a rare experience as shoppers are often left to 'fend for themselves', and then, when you find what you want, check yourselves out through the 'self-checkout line'.

Something similar has happened in many of our churches. People come expecting to be served and don't realize that God may be calling and leading them to find ways to serve and help others. God loves us and serves us in a personal way through His Word & Sacraments and the fellowship of His people.

And then God tells us, as we read in God's Word, "Serve one another!" Serve one another with the gifts that God has given to you.

Last Sunday, 80 members heard the reports and updates of what is happening in ministry here at Peace Lutheran. We approved appointments to the Church Council, we heard updates about our church finances, the plans of the Trustees, and several other ministries. A lot of good and uplifting news was shared!

Our Transition Task Force is up and running. They are preparing a report they hope to present to the congregation within the next two months. They will share what has been identified about Peace Lutheran concerning our strengths, weaknesses, opportunities for ministry, and what we believe should be our significant identifying ministries going forward. This report (if accepted by the congregation) will then be followed by the District meeting with us to begin the official call process for gathering names and preparing for the calling of our next resident pastor here at Peace.

(The information for this report comes from our Fireside Chats last fall, recent demographic surveys, and other conversations, interviews and surveys within our church and community.)

The pastor we call will prayerfully consider his gifts and experiences and how well they match with the pastoral needs and ministry opportunities here at Peace.

That's where you, the friends and members of Peace Lutheran, play a huge role. The commitment and involvement of all our members, especially young families and youth, will have a huge influence on a pastor deciding if this is the best place for him to continue serving God with his family. It's a big difference between feeling that you are being asked to come and 'by yourself make several things happen in ministry' or if you are being asked to come and 'join a committed group in the work they are already doing!"

What can you do? If you are able, come to church! Encourage others with your presence and be counted and included in the numbers a pastor will look at as he considers our call.

What can you do? In one of the areas of need, step forward and become a part of the solution joining with others in using your God-given gifts and talents to make something happen that glorifies God and Serves fellow members and/or people of our community.

What are some possible areas of service? They are numerous – here's a quick list of some: Acolytes, Greeters, Scripture Readers, Sound & Video crew, Ushers, Volunteer Coordinator, Youth Leader, Stewardship/Loyalty Sunday, Outreach Team/visitors, Mentors, Youth Ministry Team, Mission Trip Coordinator, Sunday School & Bible Class Teachers, Confirmation Class teachers, mentors & helpers, gardeners, counters, Bell Ringers, Singers, Drama/Skits, office volunteers, spiritual care teams, people who will visit the elderly, etc.

How might you serve? What needs are you aware of? What are areas where you have thought, "Somebody should do this!"? Is it possible that God has placed awareness of that need on your heart because you are to be part of God's answer to this need?

Trust the Lord! Follow where He leads! Know that I and others here at Peace are willing to work with you and help you get started in new and growing ways to serve. And, as we have said before: "Serve with joy and thanksgiving in your heart to God!" May we see the needs and opportunities for service not as a burden, but rather as a privilege given us by God!

Our time is fleeting. People of all ages are perishing. People around us need to be encouraged in their faith or by God's grace brought to saving faith. Who will serve?

The market strives to increase access to healthy foods for all and hope this helps the senior population.



I have been with you about one year now. By the grace of God, many awesome things have happened! People have stepped up to serve using their gifts of time, talents and treasures. This past year, our regular giving has increased 27%! Praise God for his blessings! In addition, we have made a huge dent in our debts, paying down over a half million in the past 18 months! We had a youth lock-in at the Peace Center! We have taken steps that are getting us closer to the day of our next resident pastor AND our next DCE (Director of Christian Education & Youth Ministry). We hope to soon be able to announce a possible path forward for sustainable, Christ-centered, childcare.

Many good things have happened, but they didn't happen in a vacuum. God, with His gifts and blessing, moves His people forward in joyful and meaningful ministry. In any good thing that takes place, to God be all the glory!

How is God moving you forward? What are possible ways that you could serve? What do your family and friends tell you would be a good fit for your gifts and abilities?

- 31. Thank God for the opportunity to serve the High School students through the HAY (Hutchinson Area Youth)


