Office Hours: Monday and Friday 9-noon Tues, Wed, Thurs 9 - 4 Jan'e Fryar wrote this following 'Sharpen the Focus' devotion for the above reading: God's Word is a 'lamp for our feet and a light for our path' (Psalm 119:105) Especially in Jesus, the Word made flesh, the Light of the world, we receive the insight and power we need so that we can avoid stumbling around in ungodliness.

ORGAN REPAIRS

Repairs to our pipe organ have been scheduled for early 2024.

We will be removing the Festival Trumpet and some of the Trombone boots for straightening and reinforcement. The metal is very thin and the pipes have been warping.

Pipes will be delivered to Dobson Organ Company in Iowa for repairs, and then reinstalled with extra bracing to avoid future issues.

Cost will be approximately \$5200 to Moe Pipe Organ Co for the removal of pipes, the new bracing and re-installation. Estimated cost for Dobson Pipe Organ Company in Iowa for the repairs to the pipes is \$5600. We will also need to rent a truck for delivery and pick up. This contract is "Time and Materials" based on actual work that needs to be done. Total cost should be around \$12,000.

A designated fund has been created for donations towards repairs.

There will be a similar event on Nov 29th called "Carols and Bells".

- 3. **Treasurer's report**: Justin will share the audit report in September. A copy of the balance sheet was shared and discussed.
- 4. Trustee's Report: Justin reported that the Trustees are looking to change their Mission Statement.

Justin will bring the new Statement to the September council meeting to be discussed.

The Cemetery Board is now a part of the Trustees.

The Fellowship Hall and outside area of Peace Center will be painted soon..

Peace Place: Roof repairs will be the last week in September.

5. **Elder's Report**: Wayne reported they are continuing to work on reaching out to members/non-members/past members.

Pew card for collection: A committee will look at creating this, to be used during collection time during services for those that can share that they have given online.

Elders discussed the idea of hymnal liturgy being used in one service per month.

Discussion on "sharing the peace" (greeting) and bringing this back into services, using hymnal liturgy being used in one service per month, and also on having another pastor join in to do a bible study on

Wednesdays, as Pastor Asher had done in the past.

- 4. Update on childcare center: Chuck shared that there will be a meeting on August 16 with the Ad Hoc Committee.
 Chuck will update the council at the September meeting.

New Business

Organ repairs: Moe Pipe Organ Company found damaged pipes. Estimate is \$5200 to repair damages.
 An organ cleaning will be needed in the future which may remove services from the sanctuary for 2-3 weeks. Cost

of the cleaning is unknown at this time.

2. Bylaws: Melissa will meet with Sue and Chuck and present at the next Council meeting.
