Good News of Great Joy
The angel said to them, "Do not be afraid. I bring you good news of great ioy that will be for all the people. Today in the city of David a Savior has been born to you; He is Christ the Lord." Luke 2:10-11

Fireside Chats: A year ago at our Fireside Chats we read from Ephesians: "...walk in a manner worthy of the calling to which you have been called, speaking the truth in love, as each part does its work

What is your calling, your part?

## Opportunities for Action

1.Attend key meetings of the congregation \& add your voice to the conversation as we determine, with prayer, our path forward together!
2.Crucial meetings for the entire congregation on December $3 \& 10$. These meetings will start soon after the 10:30 am service in the Peace Center. I URGE YOU TO ATTEND, BE INFORMED AND BE PART OF OUR DECISION! There's never a convenient time for such meetings, but these are so important! These meetings are about our potential to once again be connected to a childcare \& preschool ministry here at Peace. On December 3 we will hear the report of the Ad hoc committee about our options. On December 10 all of us here at Peace will decide on how we want to move forward.
3.Some questioned the decision of the Council nearly two years ago to close the childcare. They felt the financial concerns and the decision should have been brought to the congregation. Well, all of us together, now have the opportunity to be part of the decision, on how we will choose to proceed in a way that we believe God is calling us all to support. What will we decide? [Know that if you choose not to come, then you are saying that you are comfortable with and plan to support whatever is decided!!!!
4.The Call Committee has turned in the proper forms and the names nominated by members. We now wait for our Pastor Call List from the district. In the meantime, we continue in ministry, we pray for one another, our pastors, our call committee and we pray for our next resident pastor. God's will be done, and in His time!
5.We will soon be calling our next resident pastor!

But I continually hear people mention and I see the need for us to also call a DCE (Director of Christian Education \& Youth Ministry). Other possibilities going forward: childcare, a $2^{\text {nd }}$ pastor, Christian counseling center, etc. We can't 'print money. We can't move forward with ministries without financial commitments already in place!
6. Know that your church leadership is committed to never again add to the church's debt. When we choose to go forward with something, it will be with needed support \& commitments in place!
7.I will be working with the Treasurer and our Office Manager to put together rough estimates of what a ministry financial support budget might look like for various scenarios going forward.
8. Details are still being worked out, but sometime in January I hope to see us have another Stewardship Commitment Sunday. I cannot and will not do this by myself. I will need at least $2-3$ people to join me in this effort. Will you be one of them?
9."As each part does its work" The Biblical model often used for proportional financial offerings \& ministry support is the tithe. Giving $10 \%$ of our net income to help provide what is needed to operate and cover the costs of our shared ministry. If a person is new to the idea, I suggest that they try to start at the $4 \%$ level and commit to working up $1 \%$ a year. For example, if their income is $\$ 52,000$ ( $\$ 1,000$ a week). A tithe ( $10 \%$ ) would be an offering of $\$ 100$ a week. ( $4 \%$ would be $\$ 40$ each week.)
10. God has blessed our efforts to pay off our past church building \& remodeling debt. In the past 18 months, we have lowered our annual interest costs by close to $\$ 40,000$. Debt free in 4 years?
11. If 50 families decide to start (or increase) their offering/tithe $\$ 40$ a week, that turns into an additional $\$ 2,000$ in offerings each week for a total of $\$ 104,000$ for the year. [100 families = $\$ 208,000$ ] Such commitments make a huge difference in ministry, staffing and debt reduction decisions. It is not responsible to plan a deficit budget and trust that somehow the needed extra money will just show up. Trust in God reflected in our commitments comes first!
12. I have been often asked about when we will call a DCE. What comes first, the person in that position or the commitments and volunteers to support such a position? I think we each know the answer. Without the commitments and volunteers in place, how do we make the case to a DCE considering our call: "Trust us, if you come it will all just fall into place..... really??"
13. For families who already tithe, please know that we are all thankful for what you already
do in support of the ministry of the church. We are NOT asking you to do more than what you already do! Thank you for your continued support and commitment to our shared ministry!
14. What will we do? What is our commitment? You have leadership that is determined to be good stewards of the ministry support budget. They are committed to continuing to improve the accuracy, timeliness and transparency of various needed reports and updates. The key is each of us and our commitments!
15. What will we see next year? What will we see two years from now? Here is what I see in two years: (though I would no longer be here). I see great potential! I see a 'all in' congregation that is tithing and giving their offerings to the praise of God with joy! I see you having a pastor and a DCE. I see the debt close to being paid off, and Peace in the process of calling a $2^{\text {nd }}$ pastor. I also see a Lutheran Christian childcare on our campus!
16. What would it take for that dream to become reality? Prayer, trust in God, and a commitment of God's people to no longer sit back and wait and watch and wonder, but instead stepping up, trusting, giving and doing, all with joy and with praise and thanksgiving to God!
17. Will it happen? Frankly, it's all up to you. What will you do? Don't ask about what others will do? It is now time to ask yourself, your spouse, your family.... What will we do? The resources to do what I have shared in my 'dream' are resources that God has already provided to the people already on the membership roles of Peace Lutheran.
18. May God help and guide us in continuing to grow as a fellowship of caring and committed people joined together, and working together as one in the love of Christ! What a blessing that would be to each of us and everyone around us!

## What will we do? <br> "Lord, what is it that You want us to do?"

Regardless of what you each decide to do right now, please stay open to God's will and desire for you! Trust in the Lord, lean on Him, and follow where He leads! Trusting in Jesus, we have God's promise of forgiveness of sins and eternal life with God in heaven. Let's do everything we can to help others share in that joy!

## Organ Repairs

Repairs to our pipe organ have been scheduled for early 2024
We will be removing the Festival Trumpet and some of the Trombone boots for straightening and reinforcement. The metal is very thin and the pipes have been warping.
Pipes will be delivered to Dobson Organ Company in lowa for repairs, and then reinstalled with extra bracing to avoid future issues.
Cost will be approximately $\$ 5200$ to Moe Pipe Organ Co for the removal of pipes, the new braing and reinstallation. Estimated cost for the repairs to the pipes is $\$ 5600$. We will also need to rent a truck for delivery and pick up. This contract is "Time and Materials" based on actual work that needs to be done. Total cost should be around $\$ 12,000$.
A designated fund has been created for donations. We have received approx. $\$ 6000$ in donations thus far.
