

A Message from Congregation President

Dear Members,

This year has been awesome at Peace! We continue to move forward in many areas, working as one church body to the glory of God.

Serving as an Intentional Interim, Pastor Glenn Meyer has helped our congregation through a healing process. With his guidance, we're learning to tackle our problems and deal with small issues, in order for us to solve them and keep moving forward. The dedication of Sue Kroyer and Dr. Joan DeVee Dixon continues to humble us as they work diligently to help provide the necessary support our congregation needs. Along with Jill Lieder and the many volunteers, our congregation has been exceedingly blessed.

This year we must also be very proud of each other. The debt reduction efforts have been amazing! Through the efforts of various fundraisers, the matching of funds from the Congregational Fund, and the tremendous generosity of our congregation, we have paid \$640,035.99 toward the principal of our building debt. This could not be possible without you! In October, with the assistance of Pastor Stefan Wismar, Assistant to Pastor Woodford, President of MN South District LCMS, we were allowed to move forward with the next steps in calling a Senior Pastor. In December, a call committee was formed and began the work of reviewing the names of the Pastors shared from the District office. That work continues into early 2024, moving toward the eventual call of our next Pastor.

Following extensive work done by an Ad hoc committee, the congregation voted in December to put together a team of people to investigate the possibility of opening a childcare facility in the former location of LLCC. This facility would be a separate entity, following a setup similar to the Prince of Peace Retirement Living facility. That group of people is just getting established and will continue into 2024 with their important work.

The Council would like to thank you for all the volunteer hours, your financial and prayerful support of all the ministries here at Peace, and for serving our Lord by loving and caring for one another.

Visitation Ministry

To Peace Lutheran Church, Hutchinson MN, Visitation People & Places

"ATTHIS POINT" was the begining of a life summation and analysis that I began writing six months ago. I was taking under consideration a number of factors that were determinig or influencing my life's style and direction. Taken into consideration were the aging process in general, health issues or lack of them, stamina, mental acuity, relational abilities, family relationships and responsibilities, and within the family any developing changes or needs. And so through a plethora of major and minor thoughts considering what was wise and safe. For the last several years I had set an evaluation schedule for every five months. My next personal evaluation time is the close of January.



Since my August evaluation a few changes seemed in order, one of which was to move my visitation programing to one day each week instead of a four-or-five-day week. I settled on Wednesdays in consultation with family, individuals, and facilities, and put that program in place. It was very workable with blessings from family, doctors, and participants.

Then December 4th happened with Melba sustaining injuries from head to toe in an automoblie accident. She was hospitalized at HCMC with five fractured ribs, punchured lung, three or four fractured vertebrae in her neck, broken or damaged bones in her arms and legs, a tramatic brain injury and finished her stay there in the Knapp Acute Rehab unit, released to home December 22. Under the continuing care of ADARA she has physical therapy, occupational therapy, speech therapy and nursing care. She has shown remarkable improvement having been given permission, first to stand, than to walk with a walker with a goal of not needing to be reliant on the wheelchair in the house. She continues to need 24-hour help and care.

So, at this point, with the end of January coming soon, it seems that I will be able to continue with my Sunday preaching because our kids will be present to assist at home. As I consider my visitation ministry, which has been meaningful, rewarding, filled with joy and many learning opportunities from individuals, I must consider the time element away from home. Consequently, at this point I deem it necessary to suspend my ministry, at least for a period of time. It hurts my heart to do so, and I would hope to resume my ministry on a modified basis sometime in the future if the family and congregation are amenable. A number of factors, obviously, will need to be considered.

So, at this point, of over 23 years of meaningful ministry, I share this letter with you in a spirit of thankfulness and praise. It has been a continuous highlight in my retirement. Blessings to all.

Parish Health Ministry

The purpose/mission of the Parish Health Ministry Committee is to promote health and wellness of body, mind, and spirit for Peace congregation and the surrounding community.

We provide coffee and treats in Peace Center between services and during Bible Study. We had a fundraiser with Thrivent help for two Sundays with the money going to the Taxi service. Taxi service is available for all worship services. Members call the taxi to arrange what is best for them, giving them more independence and flexibility. Parish Health pays for this service and it costs an average of \$500/month. Parish Health is not included in the church budget.

Red Cross Bloodmobile is on the second Tuesday each month. Volunteers from Peace and also from the community are faithful workers. We made a record collection of 155 one month. Red Cross reports most blood drives average around 25 units collected. Peace averages 130-140 units per month.

Driver safety programs through Minnesota Department of Transportation are provided for members and the community and provide discount on insurance and makes safer drivers.

We provide personal care items in the women's restrooms and also provide personal size tissues for worship serves. Some members have given us medical dressings they had left after surgeries healed etc. They have been made available for the congregation's personal use.

Because the Sunday School chose not to do the Shoebox ministry this year, we offered it to the congregation. Members donate all year and we had enough supplies to complete over 60.

Prayer shawls are made by members and are given to those who can use the comfort and prayers. We provide the yarn and patterns for those that want it but many crafters provide their own. We thank them.

We were the nurses available for VBS. We gave first aid kits to Peace graduates. We worked with Common Cup to collect school supplies, diapers, warm coats, backpack food items, back packs and distribute information about their activities.

Congregational Fund

The Congregational Fund Committee was established in 1993 to encourage members and friends of Peace Lutheran Church to make lasting gifts and bequests that will continue serving in their memory long after the gift is made. It is set up as an endowment fund with only the intrest allowed to be used by the church.

Currently, all interest earned from the Congregational Fund is being directed to help pay for the building mortgage at Lutheran Church Extension Fund (LCEF). The Congregational Fund is contributing \$5000/mo. towards the \$14,167.90 monthly payment that is made to LCEF. In 2023, the Fund matched \$190,000 in congregation members' principal payments to the mortgage.
