FROM THE DESK OF PASTOR GLENN MEYER, IIM

"Repent therefore, and turn back, that your sins may be blotted out, 20 that times of refreshing may come from the presence of the Lord.." Acts 3:19-20

This year, the month of March is, for us at Peace Lutheran, a month of preparation, repentance, redemption and renewal (new life).

Preparation in that we are in the season of Lent and continuing in our Lenten Series 'Lent: A Time For Renewal'. 

people learn about Jesus and what is offered to all in Christ, (and only in Christ!) one day they will perish in unbelief. They will find that what they were 'in to' has failed them and they will be falling 'into' hell. Jesus tells us in John 14:6, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me."

For my devotion in visits last week I shared Jesus' words to Martha from John 11: "25 Jesus said to her, "I am the resurrection and the life. Whoever believes in Me, though he die, yet shall he live, 26 and everyone who lives and believes in Me shall never die. Do you believe this?"

What powerful words! These words were part of my last visit and devotion with Lester who is now with the Lord in heaven. For those who are 'into' Christ, who believe and trust in Jesus as their Lord and Savior, we have this promise that though our body may die, our soul, and the eternal life that is ours in Jesus, goes on with God in Paradise until the day of the resurrection at the last day!

God's promise to us in Jesus is forgiveness and eternal life! Something all need to hear and know, especially when we are facing death!

Repentance is a key element of the season of Lent and our daily walk with Jesus. Confession and absolution is a central element of the start of nearly every worship service we have. Saying words like 'I'm sorry' and 'I forgive you' continue to be an important part of the healing and reconciliation that is essential to daily family (& congregational) life. And, as we are reminded from Peter's sermon in Acts 3, repentance is a key essential step in our walk with God that in Christ Jesus we may experience 'Times of Refreshing.'

Redemption is proclaimed again and again whenever God's people worship together or ponder God's Word of Promise. Watch and listen when again on Maundy Thursday we hear Jesus, Christ our Passover Lamb, say, "Take eat, this is My body, Take drink, this is My blood which is shed for you for the forgiveness of your sins." Observe and ponder again the words that Jesus utters from the cross and take to heart His Words of 'mission accomplished' when He cries out, "It is finished!" In Jesus we have received the blessing of all our sins paid for, forgiven and washed away in the suffering and death of Jesus, cleansed of all our sins through the atoning sacrifice of Jesus. As read in I John 1:7, "The blood of Jesus His Son cleanses us from all sin."

Truly something for all to 'get in to!"

Renewal, (new life, rebirth in Christ Jesus)

Il Corinthians 5, "17 Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old has passed away; behold, the new has come... 18 All this is from God,entrusting to us the message of reconciliation.... we are ambassadors for Christ, God making His appeal through us."



Visitation Ministry

To Peace Lutheran Church, Hutchinson MN, Visitation People & Places

"ATTHIS POINT" was the begining of a life summation and analysis that I began writing six months ago. I was taking under consideration a number of factors that were determining or influencing my life's style and direction. Taken into consideration were the aging process in general, health issues or lack of them, stamina, mental acuity, relational abilities, family relationships and responsibilities, and within the family any developing changes or needs. And so through a plethora of major and minor thoughts considering what was wise and safe. For the last several years I had set an evaluation schedule for every five months. My next personal evaluation time is the close of January.



Since my August evaluation a few changes seemed in order, one of which was to move my visitation programing to one day each week instead of a four-or-five-day week. I settled on Wednesdays in consultation with family, individuals, and facilities, and put that program in place. It was very workable with blessings from family, doctors, and participants.

Then December 4th happened with Melba sustaining injuries from head to toe in an automoblie accident. She was hospitalized at HCMC with five fractured ribs, punchured lung, three or four fractured vertebrae in her neck, broken or damaged bones in her arms and legs, a tramatic brain injury and finished her stay there in the Knapp Acute Rehab unit, released to home December 22. Under the continuing care of ADARA she has physical therapy, occupational therapy, speech therapy and nursing care. She has shown remarkable improvement having been given permission, first to stand, than to walk with a walker with a goal of not needing to be reliant on the wheelchair in the house. She continues to need 24-hour help and care.

So, at this point, with the end of January coming soon, it seems that I will be able to continue with my Sunday preaching because our kids will be present to assist at home. As I consider my visitation ministry, which has been meaningful, rewarding, filled with joy and many learning opportunities from individuals, I must consider the time element away from home. Consequently, at this point I deem it necessary to suspend my ministry, at least for a period of time. It hurts my heart to do so, and I would hope to resume my ministry on a modified basis sometime in the future if the family and congregation are amenable. A number of factors, obviously, will need to be considered.

So, at this point, of over 23 years of meaningful ministry, I share this letter with you in a spirit of thankfulness and praise. It has been a continuous highlight in my retirement. Blessings to all.


