Pastor's message

The summer season scripture readings usually relate stories or teachings regarding our living out the Christian life. For example on July 7 the epistle lesson (2Cor.12) will talk about suffering and by the end of the month the epistle lesson (Ephesians 3:20) will conclude with the amazing statement, "Now to him who is able to do far more abundantly than all that we ask or think,....to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus throughout all generations, forever and ever. Amen." Let that soak in for the month. You might say, "who me? Are you kidding!" God does single out some folks to be leaders, pastors, teachers and so forth. And God calls each of us to step up to the responsibility that we can do far more abundantly than What? Our normal response could be, "I thought that was the pastor's job, I thought we hired someone to do that for us. The Fall season will be coming upon us and that brings many activities that need volunteers. I encourage each of us to not only pray but step up and help.

As a congregation we continue to pray for our called pastor. The ministry of prayer is an important one. We pray for our congregation's need and we rejoice with our Christian brothers and sisters at Our Savior's who will install their new pastor on July 14, 2024.


