OCCASIONAL SALE UPDATE

Thank you to all the shoppers and volunteers and those who have generously donated items for our sales at Peace. The May total sales were \$1,844.20! One quarter of the May 1st sales, \$461.05, was donated to Birthright, \$461.05 will go towards utilities and maintenance and half of the sales, \$922.10, will go towards debt reduction. The next sale will be two days, June 5th (10-6) & June 6th (10-4). One quarter of the June sales will be divided between our Youth and the local Food Shelf. The sale will be expanded into the garage area of Peace Place and we will be accepting sporting goods, tools, gardening and outdoor items. <u>Donation</u> drop off dates and times are from 4:00-6:00pm on June 2nd at the "flower door" (south side of Peace Place—by the parking lot) where volunteers will receive donations.
