

Even though there were many places to shop with citywide garage sales and Faith Lutheran garage sale, we still were blessed with healthy May sales of \$1,844.20. Half of the proceeds, \$922.10 went to debt reduction, \$461.05 went to Birthright, and the remaining \$461.05 to utilities and maintenance. As always, we thank our dedicated volunteers and donors who continue to bring in amazing donations.

The next drop-off date is June 2nd from 4:00-6:00 P.M. Please ring the doorbell, and volunteers will receive your donations. Opening Prayer and Devotion by Pastor Weber, Luke 24

Approval of Minutes: Motion was made by Becky to accept the March 11, 2025, Council minutes. Seconded by Lynn. Motion carried.

Reports

- 1. Pastor's Report: Pastor Kurt gave an update on the progress of the call committee for the Director of Children, Youth and Family Ministry. He announced that all three Pastors would be participating in all three of the Easter Sunday services. The Tuesday morning men's Bible study group will be starting a new book "Mere Christianity", when they resume after Easter. The Youth Gathering in New Orleans was discussed. We have 13 youth and three adults attending. Pastor Kurt and Pastor Jeff recently attended Camp Omega with the confirmation class.
- 2. Administrator Report: Sue reported that the March occasional sale proceeds were \$2,136.40 (\$1,068.20 to debt, and \$534.10 each to McLeod County Alliance for Domestic Violence and to utilities/maintenance of the building). Plans are being made for a reception for Mabel Boelter's 100th birthday on April 13th. Final work is being done for the annual fish fry which will be held the end of this week, proceeds will go to the debt reduction. A brunch will be held Easter Sunday with the freewill offering also going to the debt. The youth are conducting a pizza sale to raise funds for their trip to the national youth convention in July.
- 3. Treasurer's Report: Justin shared the P & L for March. There was also discussion regarding the recent reduction of the debt balance dropping to below one million dollars.
- 4. Elder's Report: The March minutes were reviewed.

Old Business

- 1. Our 2024 missions and outreach activities listed in last month's Messenger were discussed
- 2. Door/entrance security was discussed. The transition has gone smoothly. There was another incident today where the police had to be called to remove someone from our building. It was discussed that in our current culture, we have to be very vigilant
- 3. Guiding Light: Painting has been completed, and the carpets shampooed. The Board is still working on acquiring their non-profit status and also seeking applications for Director.
- 4. We are still looking for more volunteers for greeters at worship services.
- 5. Governance documents and the timeline for completion was discussed

New Business

- Debt was already discussed during the Treasurer's report
- New church directory various companies are being considered for this project

Meeting was adjourned at 8:20pm
