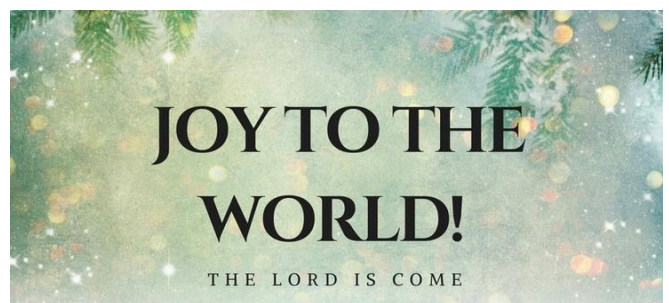

I just received an invitation to attend a reception to celebrate the 95th birthday of my high school English teacher. Reaching the age of 95 doesn't sound that rare these days, especially in our congregation. But the invitation made me think about all the students this teacher saw in class and how he must have wondered - what became of those students? For sure I was not a stellar academic or a standout thespian. But I do remember him and do remember what he tried to teach us.

We have a great amount of teaching and learning that happens in our congregation. Christmas season is an important highlight of that teaching opportunity. We remember Christmas so well because someone taught us not only the story, but also the meaning behind Christmas. Their teaching in turn, turns us into teachers too when someone asks us to explain why we have such hope in that Jesus born in Bethlehem (1Peter3:15). That's a 7th Grade Confirmation memory verse. This is the impact of what Luke wrote in chapter 2:16-18. "And they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby lying in a manger. And when they saw it, they made known the saying that had been told them concerning this child. And all who heard it wondered at what the shepherds told them"

I do like the sentiment that goes with Christmas, the memory of children thrashing through gifts, the singing of carols, watching certain Christmas movies. But I am still amazed at the love of God who gave His son to this world just so He could save us from OUR sins. That's the JOY of Christmas for me- I pray it is for you too.

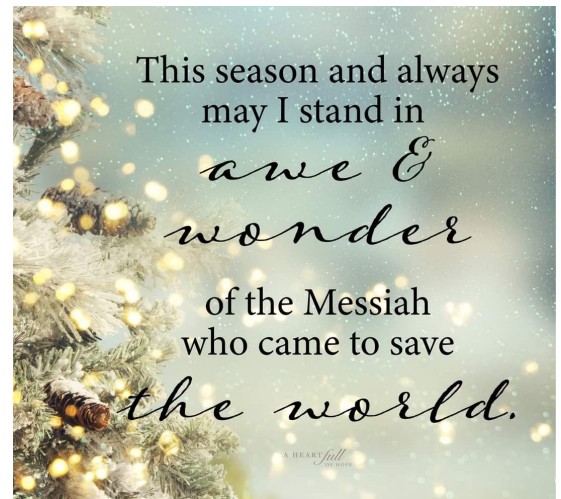

The theme is based on on Genesis 3:17 -18, "And

commanded you, 'You shall not eat of it,' cursed is the
ground because of you; in pain you shall eat of it all the
days of your life; thorns and thistles it shall bring forth

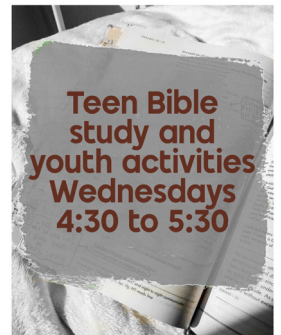
Sunday School
