


make clear his mission and priorities for us. Pray that we would not get ahead of God or behind Him.

Pipe Organ Repairs

The beautiful pipe organ will be 30 years old in 2027. We will need to do some upkeep to maintain it's amazing sound. The organ has 4 manuals - Swell, Great, Solo and Pedal. This project will be done in 2 phases.

We will be completing Phase 1 in March. This involves removing all of the Swell pipes and sending some of them to Dobson Organ Company in Iowa for repairs, then cleaning and checking everything and reinstalling all of the pipes.

Since we will be doing this in 3 stages, portions of the organ will always be available for Sundays, funerals, etc. If we did it all at once, we would be without the organ for several weeks.

MISSIONS AND OUTREACH - 2025

Here at Peace Lutheran, missions and outreach are accomplished in many facets. Not all has been monetary, some are just Christian community outreach. Many of you know of some of our missions because of personal involvement, but to let everyone know what we have been up to this past year, we decided to list these programs and, hopefully, not miss any. We also think our volunteers are amazing and are so proud of what we accomplished with their help in 2025!

Common Cup - \$2,000.00 (half of the Thanksgiving offerings) and \$1,093.33 (from the Occasional Sales); participated in the school supply collection, diaper collection, winter coat/clothes collection; year-round collection of food and personal items; 56 pizzas were donated to the homeless from our pizza sale fundraiser; Sunday School collected \$185.48 along with 191 cans of soup; 82 food items also donated during the Turkey and Ham dinner

Orphan Grain Train - Miscellaneous clothing, bedding and household items donated

McLeod County Food Shelf - \$2,335.08 (from the Occasional Sales) plus our Confirmation youth participated in the annual community-wide Trick or Treat Food Collection which collected a total of 15,655 pounds of food; 50 birthday kits were assembled and donated

Lutheran World Relief - 234 quilts and 319 layettes were assembled and shipped; Sunday School offerings of \$406.50 (spring) and \$621.30 (fall) were collected and matched by LWR

Safe Avenues - \$1,816.06 (from the Occasional Sales)

HAY Ministry (Hutchinson Area Youth) - ministered to an average of 350 high schoolers while serving free lunches 3 times (cost -almost \$3,000)

Birthright - \$461.05 (from the Occasional Sales)

The Closet - \$825.63 (from the Occasional Sales) this organization provides clothing and essentials to children in the foster system

Guiding Light Early Learning Center - use of facilities and equipment

Veterans Administration - Donations of clothing of out of season clothing from the Occasional Sales or unsellable items (all monies received from this comes back to McLeod County)

Camp Omega - First Aid and office supplies donated

Minnesota South District - \$18,525

Various Projects & Donations by Dorcas/LWML - \$7,068.71

Ministry to our home-bound members and those residing at various area facilities (which also includes ministering to non-members by our visitation team ministers)

Parish Health host monthly Red Cross Bloodmobiles; host '55 and Alive Driving Classes' every six weeks; monthly blood pressure checks; raising funds to pay for taxi service for worship (average \$7-800/month)

Conducted two 13-week Grief Share series, plus a special holiday session

Livestreaming of our Worship Services (average 5-600/weekend, peaking at over 1,000)

VBS and Release Time - open to community with many unchurched children attending

Youth - assisted with quilts and layettes, made greeting cards for our shut-ins, planned craft and game events for their visits with the residents at Prince of Peace

Community Events - Summer Concert Series; Fish Fry, Turkey & Ham Dinner; Root Beer & Bells, Carol & Bells; Cookie/Bake Sales; monthly Occasional Sales




