

Reports

1. Pastor's Report: Elia has started in our Ministry and Youth Program.

Guiding Light is open. Men's bible breakfast is on January 31, 2026
(7:30-9:00 a.m.)

New Grief Share group has started. Discussion of Lent schedule was shared. Confirmation will be on May 3 at 10:30 a.m. Goal setting committee has met and looked at about 5 goals to look at long term.

Pastor's review was done and he will begin staff reviews next.

2. Administrator/Office Report: Sue shared the following:

*The Nov. turkey & ham dinner raised \$4509.00 to put towards the building debt. Thanksgiving Day offerings of \$2000.00 went to Common Cup Ministries. In December, \$1188.00 went to the building debt from cookie sales. The luncheon on 12/21 raised \$949.00 from a goodwill offering which also went to the building debt.

After 15 months, the occasional sales have raised \$44,190.00. \$26,000

of this went to building debt, \$9000.00 to community outreach, \$649 to the foodshelf in December 2025, and \$535 to Common Cup in January 2026.

Fish Fry is set for March 13, 2026.

Approximately 260 families partook in church directories pictures.

In 2025, \$731,889.63 was paid off on the building debt.

3. Treasurer's Report: Justin shared what will be given out at the annual meeting on 2-1-26. The P & L for January-December 2025 was shared.

4. Elder's Report: We read over the minutes shared.

5. Biannual Congregational Fund Report: minutes were shared. Scott Haag will present these at the Annual Congregational Meeting on 2-1-26.

a. Do we have a lease agreement in place? We do have a certificate of occupancy.

3. Goal setting committee members: discussed in Pastor's notes.


